- Cyd's Kitchen provided 244 meals to 23 people during the month.

 - Ukulele: 2 members
- The COA bus provided 23 rides to 7 clients.
- Senior Fitness, Zumba, Yoga and Meditation/Chair Exercises continue to air at 10:00 a.m. during the week on Channel 13.
- In August, the staff returned to work. The front office staff has alternating shifts to observe social distancing.
- Coffee Talk with Kari and Sherrie has begun on Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. via Zoom.

- Sight Loss Support Group is conducting monthly conference calls.
- Approval is being sought to conduct 1:1 meetings in the Community Building for Mobile Dental, Podiatry, Elder Law and Outreach (Housing Assistance, SNAP, Fuel Assistance.) If request is denied, meetings will take place remotely (Zoom, telephone, email) with applications/documents being dropped off in the drop box.

OTHER BUSINESS:

• Lenovo laptops are now being researched to distribute to Seniors in need. All applicants will be screened by Kari. At \$400-\$500 each, we can purchase 20 laptops (as opposed to the 10 tablets that were previously compared). One noted obstacle may be the requirement of internet access and the associated cost(s). Meghan will continue to research and then provide training to the seniors receiving the laptops.
