Karen Rea, Eversource Energy Ronnie Goldstein Community Relations

Karen Rea stated at the May 5<sup>th</sup> Board of Selectmen's meeting Eversource presented a petition for two new polls and overhead lines on Grasslands Lane to service a new home on 1 Maple Avenue in Cataumet. After listening to abutters concerns the Board asked Eversource to offer alternative options to service the new home so the abutting neighbors could discuss other options with the homeowner. The public hearing was continued until June 2<sup>nd</sup>. On May 22 Eversource had a site meeting with the homeowner and a few of the abutting neighbors. We presented them with three alternative options which included estimated cost. On June 1 the homeowner informed Eversource that she has concluded her discussions with her neighbors and she would agree to one of the alternate underground options. Based on the customers decision Eversource is formally withdrawing the original petition for overhead service and will be submitting a new petition for a new underground service in the coming days and hopes to be put on the next available agenda.

Regarding Pole number 3 on the new proposal - Karen Cronburg - 4 Grasslands Lane - said as far as they can tell pole 3 is on their property. A preliminary review indicated it was in the right-of-way. Concerned an underground option would be digging up part of our property, which we do not want. Another concern is it sparks after a rainstorm. We would be interested in an option to eliminate pole 3 and have the underground go to pole 2. Glenn Cannon said that Tim Lydon, town engineer technician, believes the pole is on town property.

Peter Lewitt, 8 Grasslands Lane wanted to thank the Board for listening to the residents and giving them a chance to look at different options. Support the motion to withdraw the proposal and when it is presented to go underground, will support that.

Tara Greco, 1 Maple Ave, hopefully this proposal will be approved, it is delaying the completion of this house.

# b. COVID-19 Update

Tony Schiavi gave an update. We are currently in Phase 1, the end of Phase 1 should be on June 8<sup>th</sup>. By Friday there should be more specifics on Phase 2. Phase 2 includes opening restaurants.

Terri Guarino said the Governor's Order #35 which indicates the Board of Selectmen shall establish processes for approving requests for modification to food establishments and seating within those. We have been developing workflows, centralized way for the town departments to look at information.

Documentation for mandatory workplace standards

Tony Schiavi spoke about the outdoors seating; the Board of Selectmen can modify liquor licenses for new temporary outdoor spaces. The Board has to approve the process for restaurants on how to modify outdoor seating or create outdoor seating when they don't have any space.

James Potter brought up that there may be restaurant that will be asking for public land that do not have private land for outdoor seating.

Judy Froman said through the CCMPO (Cape Cod Metropolitan Planning Organization) we were notified at the end of April it was approved to have a feasibility study of the commuter rail to Bourne, would like time to get that information.

Mary Jane Mastrangelo said the Board needs to vote to not support the article and recommends a motion of indefinite postponement.

Glenn Cannon said there is no mechanism for exiting the MBTA, only on how to join the MBTA. The Town of Bourne can vote to get out. Not sure how long the process takes.

Bob Troy said this is a private petition. It is the petitioner's responsibility to produce the proposed motion. The Board makes a decision as to what is to be put on the warrant, a private petition is not optional. There is a warrant article the Board has to decide are you supporting it or not. The Board needs to vote on whether it will support that particular article.

James Potter said the Board has to decide if we support this article. Peter Meier said we can vote to support or not support; if it is to not support the article as submitted by private petition and our motion is to recommend a motion of indefinite postponement of this article.

George Slade withdrew his motion Peter Meier withdrew his second.

MOTION: We move that the Town approve Article 1 as set forth in the Warrant and further move that the sum of \$414,247 (\$62,347 for elected officials' salaries and \$351,900 for the Finance Committee Reserve Fund) be raised and appropriated and \$150,000 be transferred from Free Cash as set forth in the article for Accrued Contractual Compensated Absences.

#### Article 2

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 2.

MOTION: We move that the sum of Seventy Million Three Hundred Seventy Three Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Six Dollars (\$70,373,266) be hereby appropriated from the funding sources listed below to defray the expenses of the Municipal Town Departments in the chart entitled "These Amounts are to be Voted" as shown below for the fiscal year July 21, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

The Board members discussed Article 3

Tony Schiavi explained how they came up with the budget. Mr. Schiavi recommend the budget stay as presented at this dollar amount.

Peter Meier questioned if we can help these social service agencies. George Slade questioned if we re-establish a portion of that. James Potter said we can entertain this in the fall, we will have better data and better input.

Judy Froman would like to support the Human Services. Have them put forward ideas and what their recommendations are.

Mary Jane Mastrangelo said this motion doesn't represent the budget that is presented in the handbook Ms. Mastrangelo said the Board of Selectmen need to talk about how the Board is going to be informed and what reports the Board is going to get during the course of the Fiscal Year so they understand what is happening in the budget and what moves between departments are happening.

#### Article 4

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 4

MOTION: We move that the sum of \$10,476,805 be authorized to be expended for the operation of the Integrated Solid Waste Management Enterprise Fund for fiscal year July 1 2020 to June 30, 2021 as follows (Salaries, Expenses, Reserve Fund, Host Community Fee). And we further move that the sum of \$2,261,996 be transferred to the General Fund to offset the ISWM Enterprise Fund indirect expenses and in order to meet this appropriation. we further move the sum of \$11,680.771 be raised from ISWM Enterprise Receipts and \$1.058.030 be transferred from ISWM Retained Earnings.

#### Article 5

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 5

MOTION: We move that the Town vote to appropriate \$481,000 to pay costs of the capital outlay protects listed in the schedule printed with the motion and to meet this appropriation, we move to transfer the sum of \$81,000 from Sewer Retained Earnings: \$200,000 from the Waterways Improvement Fund and \$200.000 from Free Cash to satisfy this article.

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 3

MOTION: We move the sum of \$1,206,411 be authorized to be expended by the Sewer Commissioners for the operation of the Sewer Department for fiscal year July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 as follows: (Salaries, Expenses, Reserved Fund amounts). And we further move that the sum of \$140,944 be transferred to the General Fund to offset Sewer Enterprise indirect expenses and in order to meet this appropriation we move that the sum of \$1,297,355 be raised from Sewer Enterprise Receipts and \$50,000 be transferred from Sewer Retained Earnings.

MOTION: We move that the Town vote to hear reports and recommendations of Committees and Town Officers.

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 7

MOTION: We move that the Town to vote to close out the articles as printed in the schedule in Article 7 of the Town Meeting Warrant and to transfer the balances as follows: \$1,022.25 to Historic Preservation Reserves, \$244,424.64 to Community Preservation Undesignated Fund Balance and \$4,500.00 to Open Space Reserves.

#### Article 8

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 8

Motion: We move that the Town vote, upon the recommendation of the Community Preservation Committee, to raise and appropriate and reserve the sum of \$1,142,995 for the Community Preservation Fund Projects and Special Purpose Reserves listed in the Community Preservation Fund Committee report as printed in Article 8; and to meet this appropriation and reserve to appropriate the sum of \$1,142,995 from FY2021 Estimated CPA Revenues.

#### Article 9

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 9

MOTION: We move that the Town vote upon recommendation of the Community Preservation Committee to appropriate the sum of \$75,000 for the purpose of administrative and operating expenses of the Community Preservation Committee for

FY2021 and to meet this appropriation to transfer the sum of \$75,000 from the Community Preservation Undesignated Fund Balance.

### Article 10

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 10

MOTION: We move that the Town vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for the purpose of this article and to meet this appropriation to transfer the sum of \$10,000 from free cash.

#### Article 11

Judy Froman read the motion for Article 11

MOTION: We move that the Town of Bourne accept General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53F<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, which establishes a special revenue fund known as the PEG Access and Cable Related Fund, to reserve cable franchise fees and other cable-related revenues for appropriation to support PEG access services and oversight and renewal of the cable franchise agreement, the fund to begin operation for Fiscal Year 2021, which begins on July 1, 2020.

James Potter questioned if Article 12 will be printed without a motion or will there be a motion in place before it goes to print. Tony Schiavi said he asked the petitioners for a motion, since it is their article. He received a motion from Mr. Fisher which is currently being reviewed.

**Voted:** Peter Meier moved and seconded by Jared MacDonald to support the motions within the handbook for Special Town Meeting Warrant Articles 1& 2 and Articles 1-11 on the Annual Town Meeting as submitted.

Tony Schiavi said we have a donation of an upweller to the Town of Bourne. We are recommending the Board accept this donation.


#### **ISWM Organizational Chart**




