#### 8.a. Calamar Construction Update – Tides of Bourne – Mr. Jerry Hill.

Jerry Hill, Executive Vice President of Calamar Construction and Development, gave an update on the Tides of Bourne project. He said that they have moved beyond some of the delays that were caused by the pandemic. In the last six to eight weeks there have been roofers, framers, site workers, concrete people, electricians, plumbers, fire suppression, and sheet rockers all working on the site. He said there has been significant work done on the inside and there will be significant work done on the outside in the coming week.

Mr. Hill said the parking lot will be put in by winter. The project will be completed in phases. The first phase, Wing A, will be substantially complete by the end of October and finished by December 1<sup>st</sup>. Wing C will be substantially complete by mid-November and finished by the end of December and the last phase will be substantially complete by December 6<sup>th</sup> and finished by January 10<sup>th</sup>. Their goal is to be totally finished with the project by February 6<sup>th</sup>.

He said that there has been a lot of interest in the property. He said that they have doubled their staff. There are now 2 on-site superintendents and 2 project managers, and the Director of Construction is heavily involved with this project. There was some discussion about supply chain issues a getting the exterior buttoned up.

#### 8.b. Barnstable County Veteran's Service Officer Update – Major (Ret) Greg Quilty.

Major Greg Quilty said that a Town Report was distributed to the Board of Selectmen prior to this meeting. Major Quilty introduced a new Veteran's Services Officer, Guy Gottshaw, who is the newest officer. Major Quilty stated that they are now staffed with the minimum number of officers that the state requires.

Major Quilty said that their two main duties are Chapter 115, the State and Town financial benefits for low-income veterans and their dependents and they file VA disability claims and pensions. Major Quilty gave a report on benefits given by Veteran's Services. He spoke about the staffing and their new website. He said the population of veterans is aging, and they need all the help they can get.

## 8.m. Interim Director of Police Services Paul Shastany – announcement of the FBI-LEEDA Trilogy designation awarded to the Bourne Police Department.

Interim Director of Police Services Paul Shastany said that he could not have done this without the leadership of Town Administrator Tony Schiavi. He said that FBI-LEEDA stands for Federal Bureau of Investigation – Law Enforcement Executive Development Associates, which is a sanctioned training for a 501c that is put on by the best command and leadership for law enforcement in the nation and it is a very structured and formal approach to how to lead police organizations.

Mr. Shastany said that Bourne is the 17<sup>th</sup> police department to receive the FBI-LEEDA Trilogy award. Lt. Brandon Esip, Lt. John Stowe and Sgt. Theodore Economides talked about the program and what they learned about being the best leaders that they can be. Chair Meier congratulated the department on their designation. Jared MacDonald said that there was no professional leadership training during the time he worked as a Police officer in the Town of Bourne and he is pleased to see that they now have a program such as this. The rest of the Board also congratulated the department.

Shawn Patterson, DPW Director, said that when he was in Marshfield, they had a bylaw that allowed them to go to Town Meeting to ask for funds to do emergency repairs on unaccepted/private roads. He said that it was very successful in Marshfield. He said the DPW would do a drive around weekly to assess the roads that needed attention, and they made a prioritized list. Mr. Schiavi said that there needs to be a process and statistics need to be tracked. Mr. Schiavi also said that most of the work would be done by subcontractors so it would not put additional stress on the DPW. Mr. Patterson said that this is basically preventative maintenance.

**Voted:** Chair Meier moved, and Judith Froman seconded, to direct the Town Administrator to draft a pothole bylaw for review by the Board of Selectmen for submission in the May 2022 Annual Town Meeting.

## 9.b. Discussion and first reading related to adopting a Town Fuel Efficiency Vehicle Policy required to support the town's application to gain Green Communities designation.

Carl Georgeson, Energy Advisory Committee Chair, gave a presentation on the Town Fuel Efficiency Vehicle Policy, which is basically for the Town to purchase only fuel-efficient vehicles when replacing vehicles, in order to apply to have the Green Communities designation, which would enable the Town to receive energy grants. In Massachusetts, there are 280 communities that have a green community designation.

**Voted:** Judith Froman moved, and Jared MacDonald seconded, to approve the First Reading of the DRAFT Fuel Efficient Vehicle Policy as presented and to discuss the second reading at the August 17, 2021, Board of Selectmen Workshop.

Mr. Slade said that CCRTA and GATRA have merged paratransit services and it will save some money. He also said that he will be sending out an Air Force questionnaire.

## Report of the Veterans Services Department

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen and the Citizens of the Town of Bourne:

The following report is of the activities of the Department of Veterans' Services for the Town of Bourne for the period July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Our duties are categorized in two basic areas: State/Town Benefits and Federal Benefits.

#### Chapter 115:

This program is covered and authorized under Massachusetts General Law Chapter 115. It provides financial assistance to honorably-discharged, veterans and qualified dependents who establish need and worthiness and are residents of the Town of Bourne. During the year the Town of Bourne, through our office, obtained benefits to qualified veterans and dependents totaling \$174,932.76 for housing, food, heat, medical and other related costs. The amount expended is reimbursed to the Town by the Commonwealth at a rate of 75% of total expenditures.

#### **Federal Benefits:**

We assisted veterans and their dependents in obtaining federal benefits under the broad umbrella of the Department of Veterans Affairs. These services included payments for service-connected disabilities, pensions, education, medical, burial, medals and records. During the year, this office assisted in obtaining \$14,446,970.88 in cash payments for compensation and pensions for Bourne veterans and their dependents which is a substantial increase over the last few years. This tax free income greatly reduces the need for Chapter 115 benefits.

We extend our thanks to the Board of Selectmen, the Town Administrator and Finance Director, town veterans' organizations and the many town employees who assist us for their outstanding support throughout the year. Town employees were especially helpful during COVID to ensure uninterrupted delivery of Chapter 115 benefits to the veterans and dependents of Bourne.

We are happy to report we have implemented our first District wide web site at <a href="https://www.capevets.org">www.capevets.org</a> where veterans can obtain information, start claims and reach out to us online.

- (a) It is understood that the Board is not required to grant the license;
- (b) In event of a proposed sale of a business requiring a Common Victualer and/or Food Vendor's License, an application for a transfer of said license will be deemed to be an application for a new license (subject to the rules and regulations herein contained), and the owner of such business shall be required to file with the Board of Selectmen a thirty-day notice of his intention to sell same before such application will be acted upon by the Selectmen;

That the license is subject to revocation if the holder of the license does not comply with state law, (c) town bylaws or the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Selectmen.



I am writing to request permission from the Town of Bourne to place a bench in the name of my late boyfriend, Colin Crowley, at the corner of Robinson and Clark Roads in the garden area, in Sagamore Beach. I have spoken with the woman who maintains the garden, Sheila Brennan Micciche, and she is entirely in support of the idea. I understand that the bench cannot say "In Memory of . . ." which is fine — we'd just like it to say *Colin James Crowley*. I have the money to pay for the bench and the Whaleback Pub, which Colin worked for, is setting up a fund to maintain the bench.

We have enclosed 41 wet-signed Bourne voter signatures, along with an additional 823 digital signatures via Change.org (both Bourne and non-Bourne residents alike). Additionally, you will find a letter from the Eagles in Buzzards Bay, which speaks to the sweet, compassionate, and selfless nature that was Colin and all the volunteer work he did for the people of Bourne.

Colin lost his life on May 25, 2021 at 1:15am when he fell asleep at the wheel while driving home late a night from the Whaleback. He hit a tree on Old Plymouth Road, not far from my home and his, after having come down Ocean Pines. His shift had actually ended at midnight at the Whaleback, but he had stayed despite being tired because he didn't want to leave the female bartender alone that late at night. I spoke with him at 11:30pm that night, while he cleaned up the Whaleback, and our last words were *I love you*.

Our neighborhood has been mourning his death and the loss of his smiling, kind face is felt both in Bourne and in Sandwich. While I know this bench cannot bring him back, it gives both the neighborhood and his father and sister some comfort to know that the town and its people, will never forget him. Colin also lost his mother suddenly his senior year of high school, and the small comfort I find is that I know she is with him. I think she was with him at the tree that night as well.

Clark Field was a favorite place for Colin. He loved playing basketball there with his two best friends, and we used to sit in the parking lot sharing an ice cream together. The position of this bench will overlook the field he adored. I believe he's still with us, watching over us, and with this bench perhaps he too can sit and see his best friends, someday, find the courage to pick up a basketball and the play the game again, without him.

Everyday we feel the loss, but everyday we seek purpose, because that's what Colin would want us to do.

I would like to tell you of Colin's generosity and charity to the people of our community.

I met Colin for the first time at the Buzzards Bay Eagles when he was volunteering in our kitchen with his Dad.

Over the next years, I had many opportunities to talk to Colin as he volunteered for various events, fundraisers and supported the work of the Buzzards Bay Eagles.

Most notably was Colin's volunteer work for our Annual Thanksgiving Dinner. This event, now in its 13<sup>th</sup> year, provides free Thanksgiving meals to anyone who is in need, no matter the circumstance. We have, in the past, served as many as 350 meals, both as a sit-down formal dinner in the club and delivery to shut-in's, local fire and police, Joint Base Cape Cod and Mass Maritime. It is a large undertaking and volunteers are needed for days before the event, as well as on the day of the holiday. Colin was a return volunteer for many years.

Last Thanksgiving, in the mist of the pandemic, we were uncertain if we would be able to host the event, but many stepped forward to encourage us to make it a drive-up, take-out dinner for all. Amongst other tasks, we needed volunteers to deliver meals, prepared and packaged in our kitchen, to the line of vehicles that circled the building... a tiring job in great weather... and we had heavy rain.

Colin was out in that rain, running back and forth from the building to the waiting cars to deliver their Thanksgiving dinners. He did this for <u>4 hours</u>, always with a smile... he helped us to serve 415 meals, our largest number in all the years our Thanksgiving Dinner has been taking place, and in circumstances that were very challenging.

# Naming Town Owned Property and Placement of Memorial Objects

#### Purpose

The Bourne Board of Selectmen shall be responsible for the naming of town owned property – identified as being under the care, custody and control of the Town of Bourne – and shall handle all requests with serious and consistent consideration. Property includes, but is not limited to, public buildings, areas within public buildings, recreational areas, memorial objects, and town-owned land, all of which does not fall under another governing body or entity. In addition, there is a provision for placing memorial objects on town-owned property.

#### Policy

The Board of Selectmen is responsible for the naming (or renaming) of any town owned properties as noted in the Policy Purpose and fall under the jurisdiction of the Board of Selectmen.

The Board of Selectmen shall implement and maintain a consistent process for evaluating naming

proposals.

When naming requests are considered, the priority shall be with naming property after person(s) or organizations which:

- Have geographical, historical or cultural significance to the town or region.
- Have held leadership role (s) in the Town, such as through distinguished service in the military, law enforcement, safety, public office, or as a public servant.
- Have made significant financial and civic contributions to the Town, or that have made a direct financial grant to the Town for purposes of developing a particular public property.
- Have been deceased no less than five years

The request for placing memorial objects (artwork, signs or other fixtures, etc.) shall also be in writing and it must be supported by 10 or more registered voters of the Town as evidenced by validated signatures. Such memorial objects examples include, but are not limited to plaques, ornamental signs, sculptures, banners, benches, plantings, and detached structures.

For property under the care, custody and control of the Conservation Commission, the Trustees of the Veterans Memorials, or the Trustees of the Library, or any other such designation, such approval of a naming request shall be determined in a joint meeting of the Board of Selectmen and the respective Commission or Board.

School properties, by State Law, fall under the jurisdiction of the School Committee.

In the case of a written proposal by an applicant for memorialization of a Veteran, the Board of Selectmen shall forward a copy of the request to the Trustees of Veteran's Memorials for consideration and verification of necessary documentation. The Trustees shall make a recommendation to the Board of Selectmen as to the naming of Town property or memorial objects in honor of the Veteran.

This Policy may be amended or rescinded by the Board of Selectmen by majority vote.

#### **Process for Naming Town Property**

A written request to name public property which includes, but is not limited to, public buildings, areas within public buildings, recreational area, memorial objects, town-owned land, must be submitted to the Board of Selectmen signed by 50, or 10 (for memorial objects), registered voters validated by the Town Clerk.

The written request must explain the following, as applicable:

- How has this person(s) or organization had geographical, historical or cultural significance to the Town or region?
- What leadership role(s) in the Town, such as through distinguished service in the military, law enforcement, safety, or public office or as a public servant?
- What significant financial and civic contributions to the Town for the purposes of developing a particular public property?
- What is the proposed memorial (plaque, statue, sign, etc.)? What is the property location (building, part of building, recreational area, etc.)?
- Verification that person is deceased no less than 5 years prior to the request.

Following certification by the Town Clerk, the Board of Selectmen shall schedule a public hearing either as part of a Board meeting or as a separate public hearing to discuss the public property naming request. Decisions for placement of memorial objects shall be made during a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Selectmen.

The Town Clerk will verify that the property has not already been named and indicate any other properties named after this person(s) or organization.

Upon Board of Selectmen's initial approval of the naming, the next level of review and approval encompasses the design of artwork, signs or other fixtures on property under the jurisdiction of the Board must be reviewed and approved along with the cost of any signage and its ongoing maintenance, as well as who will be bearing the costs (petitioner, the Town, or another entity). In advance of final approval, the Board will seek advice of appropriate boards, committees, and/or departments.






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## 10.d. Potential bylaw change related to pothole and other repairs to unaccepted roads

Article 52 of the Town of Marshfield Bylaws:

Adopted by Article 35, 1980 ATM ARTICLE FIFTY TWO - Temporary Repair of Private Ways The Department of Public Works may, subject to appropriation at the Annual Town Meeting, make temporary repairs on private ways subject to the following: a. The extent of repairs shall be to fill holes or mend other damage with materials similar to those used in the original construction. The intent of repair is to maintain the private way of present quality permitting safe passage when due caution is exercised. b. Drainage structures may be repaired or constructed to correct a poor drainage or serious flowing problem which results in excessive maintenance work. c. Repairs required by public necessity shall be performed without the requirement for petition by abutters. d. The liability of the Town for damage caused while making the repairs shall be limited to and inclusive of that recoverable against the Town as provided for under MGL, Ch. 512, Acts of 1978. e. Temporary repair of private ways will be limited to those ways which have been continuously open to public use for six years and which remain open for their future existence. Private ways posted as restricted in use to owners and/or their guests will not be maintained. Amended by Article 8, 1981 ATM

#### **DEFINITIONS**

<u>Combined city and highway MPG (EPA Combined fuel economy)</u>: Combined Fuel Economy means the fuel economy from driving a combination of 43 percent city and 57 Percent highway miles and is calculated as follows:

=1/((0.43/City MPG)+(0.57/highway MPG))

<u>Drive System</u>: The manner in which mechanical power is directly transmitted from the drive shaft to the wheels. The following codes are used in the drive field:

- AWD = All Wheel Drive: 4 -wheel drive automatically controlled by the vehicle power train system
- 4WD = 4-Wheel Drive: driver selectable 4-wheel drive with 2-wheel drive option
- 2WD = 2-Wheel Drive

<u>Heavy-duty vehicle</u>: Vehicles with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of more than 8,500 pounds

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

In an effort to reduce the Town/ school district's fuel consumption and energy costs the (policy making body) hereby adopts a policy to purchase only fuel efficient vehicles to meet this goal.

#### **PURPOSE**

To establish a requirement that the Town/ school district purchase only fuel efficient vehicles for municipal/school use whenever such vehicles are commercially available and practicable.

#### **APPLICABILITY**

This policy applies to all divisions and departments of the Town/ school district. It applies to road-worthy passenger vehicles, pick up and utility trucks, and SUVs. It does not apply to specialized equipment or off-road vehicles.

#### **GUIDELINES**

All departments/divisions shall purchase only fuel efficient vehicles for municipal use whenever such vehicles are commercially available and practicable.

The Town/ school district will maintain an annual vehicle inventory for ALL vehicles and a plan for replacing any non-exempt vehicles with vehicles that meet, at a minimum, the fuel efficiency ratings contained in the most recent guidance for Criterion 4 published by the MA Department of Energy Resources' Green Communities Division.

It is the responsibility of the Town/ school district to check the Green Communities Division's Guidance for Criterion 4 for updates prior to ordering replacement vehicles.

#### **Exemptions**

- Heavy-duty vehicles: examples include fire-trucks, ambulances, and some public works trucks that meet the definition of heavy-duty vehicle.
- As of the adoption date (above) police cruisers are exempt from this criterion due to lack of widespread availability. However, we commit to purchasing fuel efficient police cruisers, when they become commercially available. Police and fire department administrative vehicles are NOT exempt and must meet fuel efficient requirements.

#### **FUEL EFFICIENT VEHICLE REPLACEMENT PLAN**

All non-exempt vehicles shall be replaced with fuel efficient vehicles that adhere to the most recent Green Communities Criterion 4 Guidance. Vehicles shall be replaced when they are no longer operable and will not be recycled from one municipal department to another unless the recycled replacement is more efficient than the vehicle it is replacing. In addition, when replacing exempt vehicles, the function of the vehicle will be reviewed for potential replacement with a more fuel efficient vehicle, including a fuel efficient non-exempt vehicle.

Town/ school district will review on an annual basis the Vehicle Inventory, along with the Green Communities Criterion 4 Guidance, to plan for new acquisitions as part of planning for the new fiscal year budget.

#### Article 2.2 Protection of the Interest of the Town

#### Section 2.2.1

<u>Annual Inventory</u>. The head of every department of the Town shall annually, in January, take an inventory of all articles and property belonging to such department and shall file a list of these articles and property with the Town Administrator. The Town Administrator shall annually take an inventory of all articles and property in the Town offices, Town Hall and other buildings under his immediate jurisdiction and keep a copy thereof in his office.

#### Section 2.2.2

<u>Storage</u>. #### SUMMARY OF REVISION

The purpose of this LOMR is to update the Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LiMWA) for Massachusetts. Please note no new coastal analysis was conducted, and only the LiMWA is revised by this LOMR. Other effective flood hazard information is not being revised, such as Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA), Base (1-percent-annual-chance) Flood Elevations, or floodway delineations. The Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) provided updated LiMWA delineations based on the latest FEMA guidance. Please note that there are no annotated Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) or FIS attachments enclosed. However, the updated LiMWA information is available via FEMA's National Flood Hazard Layer (NFHL).

Through a recent partnership between Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the FIRMs in your community have been revised to show areas delineating the LiMWA, which separates the Coastal A Zone from the rest of the A Zone. State partners for this LOMR were the Flood Hazard Management Program Office in the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation and

We have determined that the revised LiMWA delineations are consistent with FEMA mapping policy and guidance and therefore meet the minimum floodplain management criteria of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). With this LOMR, the National Flood Hazard Layer (NFHL) has been updated to show the revised LiMWA. The NFHL is a Federal Emergency Management Agency digital database that contains flood hazard mapping data for the NFIP. The NFHL is for community officials and residents looking to view effective flood hazard information in a map viewer or download for use in a Geographic Information Systems (GIS) application. Please note that the complete updated LiMWA is not shown on the downloadable version of the FIRMs available on the FEMA Flood Map Service

The LiMWA is revised based on the coastal storm surge and wave modeling data from the most recent FEMA coastal Flood Insurance Study report for coastal communities. Communities or other affected users may request that FEMA revise the LiMWA based on better data and information that informs the identification and mapping of the LiMWA. The basis for the request to revise the LiMWA and whether or not other appealable flood hazard data is included in the request will dictate which FEMA process is most appropriate.

This LOMR does not invalidate any prior flood hazard determinations or supersede any effective Letters of Map Change (Letters of Map Amendment, LOMRs, etc.). Please note that no annotated FIRM or Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report attachments are enclosed. Future revisions to FIRMs and FIS reports will not supersede this LOMR; rather, this LOMR will be incorporated into those revised or updated FIRMs and FIS reports. The LOMR will continue to be effective for the remaining FIRMs until they all reflect this change.

In accordance with 44 CFR Paragraph 60.3(b)(4) of the NFIP regulations (copy enclosed) and your local flood damage prevention ordinance, this revised LiMWA should be used for floodplain management purposes.

Therefore, any flood plain management regulations adopted by a State or a community which are more restrictive than the criteria set forth in this part are encouraged and shall take precedence.

#### § 60.2 Minimum compliance with flood plain management criteria.

(a) A flood-prone community applying for flood insurance eligibility shall meet the standards of §60.3(a) in order to become eligible if a FHBM has not been issued for the community at the time of application. Thereafter, the community will be given a period of six months from the date the Federal Insurance Administrator provides the data set forth in §60.3 (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f), in which to meet the requirements of the applicable paragraph. If a community has received a FHBM, but has not yet applied for Program eligibility, the community shall apply for eligibility directly under the standards set forth in §60.3(b). Thereafter, the community will be given a period of six months from the date the Federal Insurance Administrator provides the data set forth in §60.3 (c), (d), (e) or (f) in which to meet the requirements of the applicable paragraph.

(b) A mudslide (i.e., mudflow)-prone community applying for flood insurance eligibility shall meet the standards of §60.4(a) to become eligible. Thereafter, the community will be given a period of six months from the date the mudslide (i.e., mudflow) areas having special mudslide hazards are delineated in which to meet the require-

ments of § 60.4(b).

(c) A flood-related erosion-prone community applying for flood insurance eligibility shall meet the standards of §60.5(a) to become eligible. Thereafter, the community will be

given a period of six months from the date the flood-related erosion areas having special erosion hazards are delineated in which to meet the requirements of §60.5(b).

(d) Communities identified in part 65 of this subchapter as containing more than one type of hazard (e.g., any combination of special flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), and flood-related erosion hazard areas) shall adopt flood plain management regulations for each type of hazard consistent with the requirements of §§ 60.3, 60.4 and 60.5.

(e) Local flood plain management regulations may be submitted to the State Coordinating Agency designated pursuant to §60.25 for its advice and concurrence. The submission to the State shall clearly describe proposed enforcement procedures.

(f) The community official responsible for submitting annual or biennial reports to the Federal Insurance Administrator pursuant to §59.22(b)(2) of this subchapter shall also submit copies of each annual or biennial report to any State Coordinating Agency.

(g) A community shall assure that its comprehensive plan is consistent with the flood plain management objectives of this part.

(h) The community shall adopt and enforce flood plain management regulations based on data provided by the Federal Insurance Administrator. Without prior approval of the Federal Insurance Administrator, the community shall not adopt and enforce flood plain management regulations based upon modified data reflecting natural or man-made physical changes.

#### § 60.3 Flood plain management criteria for flood-prone areas.

The Federal Insurance Administrator will provide the data upon which flood plain management regulations shall be based. If the Federal Insurance Administrator has not provided sufficient data to furnish a basis for these regulations in a particular community, the community shall obtain, review and

reasonably utilize data available from other Federal, State or other sources pending receipt of data from the Federal Insurance Administrator. However, when special flood hazard area designations and water surface elevations have been furnished by the Federal Insurance Administrator, they shall apply. The symbols defining such special flood hazard designations are set forth in §64.3 of this subchapter. In all cases the minimum requirements governing the adequacy of the flood plain management regulations for flood-prone areas adopted by a particular community depend on the amount of technical data formally provided to the community by the Federal Insurance Administrator. Minimum standards for communities are as follows:

- (a) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has not defined the special flood hazard areas within a community, has not provided water surface elevation data, and has not provided sufficient data to identify the floodway or coastal high hazard area, but the community has indicated the presence of such hazards by submitting an application to participate in the Program, the community shall:
- (1) Require permits for all proposed construction or other development in the community, including the placement of manufactured homes, so that it may determine whether such construction or other development is proposed within flood-prone areas;
- (2) Review proposed development to assure that all necessary permits have been received from those governmental agencies from which approval is required by Federal or State law, including section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972, 33 U.S.C. 1334;
- (3) Review all permit applications to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a flood-prone area, all new construction and substantial improvements shall (i) be designed (or modified) and adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy, (ii) be con-

structed with materials resistant to flood damage, (iii) be constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damages, and (iv) be constructed with electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, and air conditioning equipment and other service facilities that are designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding.

- (4) Review subdivision proposals and other proposed new development, including manufactured home parks or subdivisions, to determine whether such proposals will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a subdivision proposal or other proposed new development is in a flood-prone area, any such proposals shall be reviewed to assure that (i) all such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage within the flood-prone area. (ii) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (iii) adequate drainage is provided to reduce exposure to flood hazards;
- (5) Require within flood-prone areas new and replacement water supply systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems; and
- (6) Require within flood-prone areas (i) new and replacement sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters and (ii) onsite waste disposal systems to be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding.
- (b) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has designated areas of special flood hazards (A zones) by the publication of a community's FHBM or FIRM, but has neither produced water surface elevation data nor identified a floodway or coastal high hazard area, the community shall:
- (1) Require permits for all proposed construction and other developments including the placement of manufactured homes, within Zone A on the community's FHBM or FIRM;
- (2) Require the application of the standards in paragraphs (a) (2), (3), (4),

- (5) and (6) of this section to development within Zone A on the community's FHBM or FIRM;
- (3) Require that all new subdivision proposals and other proposed developments (including proposals for manufactured home parks and subdivisions) greater than 50 lots or 5 acres, whichever is the lesser, include within such proposals base flood elevation data;
- (4) Obtain, review and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation and floodway data available from a Federal, State, or other source, including data developed pursuant to paragraph (b)(3) of this section, as criteria for requiring that new construction, substantial improvements, or other development in Zone A on the community's FHBM or FIRM meet the standards in paragraphs (c)(2), (c)(3), (c)(5), (c)(6), (c)(12), (c)(14), (d)(2) and (d)(3) of this section;
- (5) Where base flood elevation data are utilized, within Zone A on the community's FHBM or FIRM:
- (i) Obtain the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new and substantially improved structures, and
- (ii) Obtain, if the structure has been floodproofed in accordance with paragraph (c)(3)(ii) of this section, the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed, and
- (iii) Maintain a record of all such information with the official designated by the community under §59.22 (a)(9)(iii);
- (6) Notify, in riverine situations, adjacent communities and the State Coordinating Office prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse, and submit copies of such notifications to the Federal Insurance Administrator:
- (7) Assure that the flood carrying capacity within the altered or relocated portion of any watercourse is maintained;
- (8) Require that all manufactured homes to be placed within Zone A on a community's FHBM or FIRM shall be installed using methods and practices which minimize flood damage. For the purposes of this requirement, manufactured homes must be elevated and anchored to resist flotation, collapse, or

- lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not to be limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors. This requirement is in addition to applicable State and local anchoring requirements for resisting wind forces.
- (c) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has provided a notice of final flood elevations for one or more special flood hazard areas on the community's FIRM and, if appropriate, has designated other special flood hazard areas without base flood elevations on the community's FIRM, but has not identified a regulatory floodway or coastal high hazard area, the community shall:
- (1) Require the standards of paragraph (b) of this section within all A1-30 zones, AE zones, A zones, AH zones, and AO zones, on the community's FIRM:
- (2) Require that all new construction and substantial improvements of residential structures within Zones A1–30, AE and AH zones on the community's FIRM have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the base flood level, unless the community is granted an exception by the Federal Insurance Administrator for the allowance of basements in accordance with §60.6 (b) or (c):
- (3) Require that all new construction and substantial improvements of nonresidential structures within Zones A1-30, AE and AH zones on the community's firm (i) have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the base flood level or, (ii) together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, be designed so that below the base flood level the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water and with structural components having the capability of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy;
- (4) Provide that where a non-residential structure is intended to be made watertight below the base flood level, (i) a registered professional engineer or architect shall develop and/or review structural design, specifications, and plans for the construction, and shall certify that the design and methods of

construction are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the applicable provisions of paragraph (c)(3)(ii) or (c)(8)(ii) of this section, and (ii) a record of such certificates which includes the specific elevation (in relation to mean sea level) which such structures are floodproofed shall be maintained with the official designated by the community under § 59.22(a)(9)(iii):

- (5) Require, for all new construction and substantial improvements, that fully enclosed areas below the lowest floor that are usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement and which are subject to flooding shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or meet or exceed the following minimum criteria: A minimum of two openings having a total net area of not less than one square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided. The bottom of all openings shall be no higher than one foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, valves, or other coverings or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters.
- (6) Require that manufactured homes that are placed or substantially improved within Zones A1-30, AH, and AE on the community's FIRM on sites
- (i) Outside of a manufactured home park or subdivision,
- (ii) In a new manufactured home park or subdivision,
- (iii) In an expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision, or
- (iv) In an existing manufactured home park or subdivision on which a manufactured home has incurred "substantial damage" as the result of a flood, be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the lowest floor of the manufactured home is elevated to or above the base flood elevation and be securely anchored to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist floatation collapse and lateral move-

(7) Require within any AO zone on the community's FIRM that all new construction and substantial improvements of residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated above the highest adjacent grade at least as high as the depth number specified in feet on the community's FIRM (at least two feet if no

depth number is specified);

- (8) Require within any AO zone on the community's FIRM that all new construction and substantial improvements of nonresidential structures (i) have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated above the highest adjacent grade at least as high as the depth number specified in feet on the community's FIRM (at least two feet if no depth number is specified), or (ii) together with attendant utility and sanitarv facilities be completely floodproofed to that level to meet the floodproofing standard specified in §60.3(c)(3)(ii);
- (9) Require within any A99 zones on a community's FIRM the standards of paragraphs (a)(1) through (a)(4)(i) and (b)(5) through (b)(9) of this section:
- (10) Require until a regulatory floodway is designated, that no new construction, substantial improvements, or other development (including fill) shall be permitted within Zones A1-30 and AE on the community's FIRM, unless it is demonstrated that the cumulative effect of the proposed development, when combined with all other existing and anticipated development, will not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than one foot at any point within the community.
- (11) Require within Zones AH and AO, adequate drainage paths around structures on slopes, to guide floodwaters around and away from proposed structures.
- (12)Require that manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved on sites in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision within Zones A-1-30, AH, and AE on the community's FIRM that are not subject to the provisions of paragraph (c)(6) of this section be elevated so that either
- (i) The lowest floor of the manufactured home is at or above the base flood elevation, or

- (ii) The manufactured home chassis is supported by reinforced piers or other foundation elements of at least equivalent strength that are no less than 36 inches in height above grade and be securely anchored to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist floatation, collapse, and lateral movement.
- (13) Notwithstanding any other provisions of §60.3, a community may approve certain development in Zones Al-30, AE, and AH, on the community's FIRM which increase the water surface elevation of the base flood by more than one foot, provided that the community first applies for a conditional FIRM revision, fulfills the requirements for such a revision as established under the provisions of §65.12, and receives the approval of the Federal Insurance Administrator.
- (14) Require that recreational vehicles placed on sites within Zones A1-30, AH, and AE on the community's FIRM either
- (i) Be on the site for fewer than 180 consecutive days,
- (ii) Be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or
- (iii) Meet the permit requirements of paragraph (b)(1) of this section and the elevation and anchoring requirements for "manufactured homes" in paragraph (c)(6) of this section.

A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.

- (d) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has provided a notice of final base flood elevations within Zones A1-30 and/or AE on the community's FIRM and, if appropriate, has designated AO zones, AH zones, A99 zones, and A zones on the community's FIRM, and has provided data from which the community shall designate its regulatory floodway, the community shall:
- (1) Meet the requirements of paragraphs (c) (1) through (14) of this section:
- (2) Select and adopt a regulatory floodway based on the principle that the area chosen for the regulatory floodway must be designed to carry the

- waters of the base flood, without increasing the water surface elevation of that flood more than one foot at any point:
- (3) Prohibit encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements, and other development within the adopted regulatory floodway unless it has been demonstrated through hydrologic and hydraulic analyses performed in accordance with standard engineering practice that the proposed encroachment would not result in any increase in flood levels within the community during the occurrence of the base flood discharge;
- (4) Notwithstanding any other provisions of §60.3, a community may permit encroachments within the adopted regulatory floodway that would result in an increase in base flood elevations, provided that the community first applies for a conditional FIRM and floodway revision, fulfills the requirements for such revisions as established under the provisions of §65.12, and receives the approval of the Federal Insurance Administrator.
- (e) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has provided a notice of final base flood elevations within Zones A1-30 and/or AE on the community's FIRM and, if appropriate, has designated AH zones, AO zones, A99 zones, and A zones on the community's FIRM, and has identified on the community's FIRM coastal high hazard areas by designating Zones V1-30, VE, and/or V, the community shall:
- (1) Meet the requirements of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) of this section:
- (2) Within Zones V1-30, VE, and V on a community's FIRM, (i) obtain the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the bottom of the lowest structural member of the lowest floor (excluding pilings and columns) of all new and substantially improved structures, and whether or not such structures contain a basement, and (ii) maintain a record of all such information with the official designated by the community under §59.22(a)(9)(iii);
- (3) Provide that all new construction within Zones V1-30, VE, and V on the community's FIRM is located landward of the reach of mean high tide:

- (4) Provide that all new construction and substantial improvements in Zones V1-30 and VE, and also Zone V if base flood elevation data is available, on the community's FIRM, are elevated on pilings and columns so that (i) the bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member of the lowest floor (excluding the pilings or columns) is elevated to or above the base flood level; and (ii) the pile or column foundation and structure attached thereto is anchored to resist flotation, collapse and lateral movement due to the effects of wind and water loads acting simultaneously on all building components. Water loading values used shall be those associated with the base flood. Wind loading values used shall be those required by applicable State or local building standards. A registered professional engineer or architect shall develop or review the structural design, specifications and plans for the construction. and shall certify that the design and methods of construction to be used are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the provisions of paragraphs (e)(4) (i) and (ii) of this section.
- (5) Provide that all new construction and substantial improvements within Zones V1-30, VE, and V on the community's FIRM have the space below the lowest floor either free of obstruction or constructed with non-supporting breakaway walls, open wood latticework, or insect screening intended to collapse under wind and water loads without causing collapse, displacement, or other structural damage to the elevated portion of the building or supporting foundation system. For the purposes of this section, a breakway wall shall have a design safe loading resistance of not less than 10 and no more than 20 pounds per square foot. Use of breakway walls which exceed a design safe loading resistance of 20 pounds per square foot (either by design or when so required by local or State codes) may be permitted only if a registered professional engineer or architect certifies that the designs proposed meet the following conditions:
- (i) Breakaway wall collapse shall result from a water load less than that which would occur during the base flood; and,

- (ii) The elevated portion of the building and supporting foundation system shall not be subject to collapse, displacement, or other structural damage due to the effects of wind and water loads acting simultaneously on all building components (structural and non-structural). Water loading values used shall be those associated with the base flood. Wind loading values used shall be those required by applicable State or local building standards.
- Such enclosed space shall be useable solely for parking of vehicles, building access, or storage.
- (6) Prohibit the use of fill for structural support of buildings within Zones V1-30, VE, and V on the community's FIRM:
- (7) Prohibit man-made alteration of sand dunes and mangrove stands within Zones V1-30, VE, and V on the community's FIRM which would increase potential flood damage.
- (8) Require that manufactured homes placed or substantially improved within Zones V1-30, V, and VE on the community's FIRM on sites
- (i) Outside of a manufactured home park or subdivision,
- (ii) In a new manufactured home park or subdivision.
- (iii) In an expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision, or
- (iv) In an existing manufactured home park or subdivision on which a manufactured home has incurred "substantial damage" as the result of a flood, meet the standards of paragraphs (e)(2) through (7) of this section and that manufactured homes placed or substantially improved on other sites in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision within Zones VI-30, V, and VE on the community's FIRM meet the requirements of paragraph (c)(12) of this section.
- (9) Require that recreational vehicles placed on sites within Zones V1-30, V, and VE on the community's FIRM either
- (i) Be on the site for fewer than 180 consecutive days,
- (ii) Be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or
- (iii) Meet the requirements in paragraphs (b)(1) and (e) (2) through (7) of this section

A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.

- (f) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has provided a notice of final base flood elevations within Zones A1-30 or AE on the community's FIRM, and, if appropriate, has designated AH zones, AO zones, A99 zones, and A zones on the community's FIRM, and has identified flood protection restoration areas by designating Zones AR, AR/A1-30, AR/AE, AR/AH, AR/AO, or AR/A, the community shall:
- (1) Meet the requirements of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) and (d)(1) through (4) of this section.
- (2) Adopt the official map or legal description of those areas within Zones AR, AR/A1-30, AR/AE, AR/AH, AR/A, or AR/AO that are designated developed areas as defined in §59:1 in accordance with the eligibility procedures under §65.14.
- (3) For all new construction of structures in areas within Zone AR that are designated as developed areas and in other areas within Zone AR where the AR flood depth is 5 feet or less:
- (i) Determine the lower of either the AR base flood elevation or the elevation that is 3 feet above highest adjacent grade; and
- (ii) Using this elevation, require the standards of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) of this section.
- (4) For all new construction of structures in those areas within Zone AR that are not designated as developed areas where the AR flood depth is greater than 5 feet:
- (i) Determine the AR base flood elevation; and
- (ii) Using that elevation require the standards of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) of this section.
- (5) For all new construction of structures in areas within Zone AR/A1-30, AR/AE, AR/AH, AR/AO, and AR/A:
- (i) Determine the applicable elevation for Zone AR from paragraphs (a)(3) and (4) of this section;
- (ii) Determine the base flood elevation or flood depth for the underlying A1-30, AE, AH, AO and A Zone; and

- (iii) Using the higher elevation from paragraphs (a)(5)(i) and (ii) of this section require the standards of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) of this section.
- (6) For all substantial improvements to existing construction within Zones AR/A1-30, AR/AE, AR/AH, AR/AO, and AR/A:
- (i) Determine the A1-30 or AE, AH, AO, or A Zone base flood elevation; and
- (ii) Using this elevation apply the requirements of paragraphs (c)(1) through (14) of this section.
- (7) Notify the permit applicant that the area has been designated as an AR, AR/A1-30, AR/AE, AR/AH, AR/AO, or AR/A Zone and whether the structure will be elevated or protected to or above the AR base flood elevation.

If the Federal Insurance Administrator has not provided sufficient data to furnish a basis for these regulations in a particular community, the community shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize data available from other Federal, State or other sources pending receipt of data from the Federal Insurance Administrator. However, when special mudslide (i.e., mudflow) hazard area designations have been furnished by the Federal Insurance Administrator, they shall apply. The symbols defining such special mudslide (i.e., mudflow) hazard designations are set forth in §64.3 of this subchapter. In all cases, the minimum requirements for mudslide (i.e., mudflow)-prone areas adopted by a particular community depend on the amount of technical data provided to the community by the Federal Insurance Administrator. Minimum standards for communities are as follows:

(a) When the Federal Insurance Administrator has not yet identified any

# Using the Limit of Moderate Wave Action to Build Resilient Coastal Communities

Coastal communities are special places and home to vital resources. What makes them so distinctive also creates a high risk of flooding. Floods are the nation's costliest natural disasters. Coastal areas are dynamic environments that are constantly reshaped by the forces of nature. Coastal communities face a range of flood hazards, including storm surge, waves and erosion. All of these can cause extensive damage to homes, businesses and infrastructure. Waves, in particular, can damage properties farther inland than one would expect.

#### Flood Maps in Coastal Areas

Flood maps, or Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), show Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA) — the areas affected by a 1%-annual-chance flood. Properties in SFHAs have a high risk of flooding. These areas have at least a 26% chance of flooding over the course of a 30-year mortgage. In coastal areas, the SFHAs are designated primarily as Zone VE or AE.

- Zone VE, a Coastal High Hazard Area, is where waves and fast-moving water can cause extensive damage during the 1-percent-annual chance flood. Wave heights of 3 feet or higher are expected.
- Zone AE is used for areas that have at least a 1% chance of being flooded in any year, but wave heights are expected to be less than 3 feet.

The primary difference between these two flood zones is potential wave damage. Structures in Zone VE have a higher risk of significant damage by the moving water and waves. As a result, buildings in Zone VE must be built to higher standards and may have higher flood insurance premiums.

#### What is the Limit of Moderate Wave Action?

FEMA has documented storm damage for decades. Post-storm damage shows that even 1.5-foot waves can cause significant damage to buildings that were not built to withstand them. To highlight this risk on flood maps, FEMA developed the Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LiMWA).

The LiMWA is an informational line that can be found on flood maps for some coastal areas. On a flood map, it is shown as a black line with black arrows that point to areas where wave heights are between 1.5 and 3 feet. It also marks the inland limit of the Coastal A Zone.





Figure 1: A flood map panel showing the Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LiMWA), indicated by the black lines with arrows. The arrows point toward the inland limit of the Coastal A Zone.

### Using the Limit of Moderate Wave Action in Floodplain Management

Due to the higher risk of wave damage to structures in the Coastal A Zone, FEMA encourages communities to apply VE Zone floodplain managements standards in this area. Communities are also encouraged to adopt the most recent International Building Codes. These require buildings in the Coastal A Zone to meet Zone VE standards. Adopting higher construction and floodplain management standards in the Coastal A Zone may also reduce flood insurance premiums.

#### Zone VE standards include:

- Buildings must be elevated on pile, post, pier, or column foundations, and must be adequately anchored to the foundation.
- Structural fill is prohibited.
- The bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member be at or above Base Flood Elevation (BFE).
- The area below the BFE must be built with flood-resistant materials and free of obstructions. If it is enclosed, the enclosure must be made of lightweight wood lattice, insect screening, or breakaway walls.
- The building design and method of construction must be certified by a design professional.

Find more information on Zone VE standards in Title 44 of the Code of the Federal Regulations, Section 60.3, and the <u>Local Officials Guide for Coastal Construction</u>.

#### What are the benefits of adopting higher codes and standards for Coastal A Zones?

- Building to higher standards makes structures and the people inside them safer from wave damage.
   Communities that adopt higher standards for the Coastal A Zone may have less damage and be able to recover more quickly.
- Communities that adopt higher building codes and standards in the Coastal A Zone may be eligible for discounted flood insurance premium rates through the Community Rating System. ### **Building Resilience in Coastal Communities**

Adopting Zone VE standards in Coastal A Zones is one step communities can take to reduce their risk and build resilience. Communities across the country are exploring more ways to move toward resilience. This may include:

- Adding freeboard. Many communities adopt freeboard, a factor of safety usually expressed in feet above the Base Flood Elevation. Communities with freeboard will require structures to be built a few feet above the BFE. Freeboard accounts for the many unknown factors that could contribute to flooding that is higher than the BFE.
- Planning for future conditions. One way to keep families, businesses, and neighborhoods safe from natural disasters is long-term planning. Communities that invest in long-term planning and forward-looking projects will see fewer impacts and are more likely to recover quickly after severe events. Preparing for the future today supports growth and health. Learn more <a href="here">here</a>.
- Incorporating nature-based solutions. Nature-based solutions weave protective natural features into a community's landscape through planning, design, and engineering. These practices can be applied to a community's built environment (for example, a stormwater park) or its natural areas (for example, land conservation). While nature-based solutions have many hazard mitigation benefits, they can also help a community meet its social, environmental, and economic goals. Learn more <a href="here">here</a>.
- Thinking beyond flood maps. FEMA flood mapping data can be used for more than floodplain management ordinances or explaining flood insurance purchase requirements. This story map highlights four communities that are using these data to reduce risk and build resilience in innovative ways.

#### Who is Eligible to Receive Funding through ECF?

Funding will be limited to nonprofit schools, libraries, and consortia of schools and libraries that are eligible for support under the FCC's E-Rate program, as well as Tribal libraries eligible for support under the Library Services and Technology Act. Funding will be prioritized for the highest needs schools based on the percentage of students eligible for the National School Lunch Program, with an additional factor based on rurality.

#### How Can Schools and Libraries Apply for Funding?

The initial application filing window will open on June 29, 2021, and close on August 13, 2021. During this time, eligible entities can submit funding requests to the FCC to cover the cost of eligible services, equipment, and devices between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. Applicants must specify if they will submit invoices or if their service provider has agreed to submit invoices on their behalf. The Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) is the administrator of the ECF program and will review applications and issue funding commitment decision letters (FCDL) for approved organizations. After receiving an FCDL, approved organizations may submit reimbursement requests to USAC. A second filing window may be opened for prospective or retrospective purchases if not all funds are used within the first filing window. Petition of NSTAR Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy for Approval of Deferral of Major Storm Threshold Amounts for 2020 Storms.

On June 25, 2021, NSTAR Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Company") filed with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") a petition for approval to defer to the Company's storm fund the major storm threshold amount associated with six calendar year 2020 storm events, or \$7.2 million, for consideration in a future storm cost recovery proceeding. The Department docketed this matter as D.P.U. 21-76.

In the Company's last base distribution rate case, the Department established the mechanics of the Company's storm fund. A storm fund-eligible event must meet a \$1.2 million incremental operation and maintenance (O&M") cost threshold and any costs that fall below \$1.2 million are not eligible for recovery through the storm fund. NSTAR Electric Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company, D.P.U. 17-05, at 548-549 (2017). Any single storm event with incremental O&M costs that exceeds \$30 million is excluded from recovery through the storm fund. D.P.U. 17-05, at 554. Additionally, the Company collects \$3.6 million annually through base distribution rates to recover a representative level of incremental O&M storm costs (based on a representative level of three storm fund eligible events per year and applying the \$1.2 million cost-per-storm threshold). D.P.U. 17-05, at 550.

In its petition, the Company states that it experienced ten major storm events in 2020 and incurred an estimated \$66.3 million in total storm response costs, inclusive of \$12 million in storm threshold amounts. According to the Company, the number of 2020 storm fund-eligible events was extraordinary and exceed the representative level of three storm events recovered in base rates. The Company further states that each of the ten storm events exceed the \$1.2 million cost-per-storm threshold. The Company requests deferral to the storm fund of the storm thresholds associated with six storm events, or \$7.2 million. The Company states that it is not requesting deferral of the seven storm fund-eligible thresholds not included in base distribution rates because the number of storm fund-eligible events is intended to be representative and expected to vary.

D.P.U. 21-76

The Company contends that the \$7.2 million for the six storm fund thresholds exceed the significance threshold for the Company's exogenous event provision and that the loss of \$7.2 million in incremental major storm response costs is harmful to the Company's ability to manage its operating costs. The Company asserts that it is precluded until January 1, 2023 under its performance based ratemaking plan from filing a base rate proceeding to adjust for the disparity.

The Department formulated its current standard for reviewing requests for deferral accounting treatment in North Attleboro Gas Company, D.P.U. 93-229 (1994). If certain conditions are met, the Department has previously allowed a company to defer accounting treatment of expenses incurred prior to a test year and considered the subsequent ratemaking treatment of those expenses in the company's next base distribution rate case. D.P.U. 93-229, at 7-8. Granting a deferral would not constitute a finding that the subject expenses are reasonable or that they can be recovered from ratepayers. D.P.U. 93-229, at 4.

Due to certain ongoing safety measures and precautions relating to in-person events as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department will conduct a virtual public hearing to receive comments on the Company's filing. The public hearing will be immediately followed by a virtual procedural conference. Any person interested in commenting on the Company's filing may submit written comments to the Department no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Thursday**, **August 12**, **2021**. At this time, all filings will be submitted only in electronic format consistent with the Commission's June 15, 2021 directive related to modified filing requirements. Ordinarily, all parties would follow Sections B.1 and B.4 of the Department's Standard Ground Rules (D.P.U. 15-184-A, App. 1 (March 4, 2020)); however, until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary.

Any person who desires to participate otherwise in the evidentiary phase of this proceeding shall file a petition for leave to intervene no later than 5:00 p.m. on **Monday**, **August 2, 2021**. A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 CMR 1.03. Receipt by the Department, not mailing, constitutes filing

and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 CMR 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 CMR 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10. All responses to petitions to intervene must be filed by the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on the second business day after the petition to intervene was filed.

All documents must be submitted to the Department in .pdf format by e-mail attachment to <a href="mailto:dpu.efiling@mass.gov">dpu.efiling@mass.gov</a>, and <a href="mailto:Tina.Chin@mass.gov">Tina.Chin@mass.gov</a>.
