Chris Southwood, Natural Resources Director, said he is recommending approval of an aquaculture license for Lang Allan of Elgin Road, for the aquaculture location at Scallop Bay Marina, 18 Wings Neck Road. He said he came before the board last year in June, to approve a license for the same site and that individual has relinquished it and is unable to move forward, so this is basically a change of name on the aquaculture license.

Chair Meier read the public hearing notice.

Chair Meier said that the Public Hearing is now open.

Lang Allan introduced himself to the Board and said that his family has been in Bourne in the same house for 100 years. He talked about what he does for conservation in the Town. Mr. Southwood explained the process of the grant and operation utilizing the aquaculture license.

Voted: Judy Froman moved, and Mary Jane Mastrangelo seconded to approve an aquaculture license amendment for Mr. Langdon Allen for hatchery and nursery production of eastern oysters and quahogs with no change to the area to be farmed, and no changes to the floats, upwellers or hatchery footprint at the Scallop Bay Marina, 18 Wings Neck Rd., Pocasset.

Connie Merigo, President, and Executive Director of the National Marine Life Center said that the Center is hosting a food truck festival on July 11^{th,} and they would like to put a banner up across the street three weeks prior to the event to attract attention to the event. Mary Jane Mastrangelo asked her to coordinate with the DPW on where to place the banner and for the hanging of the banner.

Chair Meier said that Barry Johnson has provided a list of names that Judy Froman read aloud.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Jared MacDonald seconded to appoint the list of Election Workers identified by the Town Clerk for the May 17, 2022, Annual Town Election.

Vote: 4-0-1. Chair Meier abstained.

8.d. Calamar status update with Jerry Hill.

Chair Meier said that he received an email from Jerry Hill, and he forwarded it to the rest of the board earlier in the day that said he could not attend the meeting due to a family emergency and would like to be added to the agenda for the next meeting. Chair Meier said Mr. Hill will be sending a progress report to Town Administrator McCollem, which she will forward to the Board. There was some discussion on having him at the meeting on May 24th or in June and about the prolonged construction of this project.

8.e. Discussion related to the request to erect lighting in Queen Sewell's Pond parking lot.

Robin Morse said that her husband sent an email request for more lighting in the Queen Sewell's parking lot. She said there has been some illegal and police activity there and they feel that some additional lighting may deter some of the illegal activities that happen there. She and another neighbor said that they do not feel safe in their neighborhood anymore.

Chair Meier said that additional lights may help there, and Ms. Froman said that more of a presence is needed in checking parking permits, and she is in support of more of a police presence. Mr. MacDonald said he knows that there is a shortage of police personnel so it may be difficult to get the presence that is needed, but he feels that some additional lighting would be good. There was some discussion on a possible community watch program. Chair Meier said that the Town Administrator will come up with some solutions and will provide the Board with a report. This will be on the agenda at the first meeting in June.

8.f. Discussion of Transportation Advisory Committee (continued from 3/22 meeting)

Chair Meier said that George Slade sent the Board a memo in March about questions of transportation vs. traffic advisory. He said that the construction of the bridges will be coming up and there will be discussions and he wanted to discuss reactivating the committee. Mr. Slade said that the Town should be poised to be able to discuss the bridge construction when the time comes, and a committee would be the way to do this. Ms. Mastrangelo said it would be appropriate to have this kind of committee, that is appointed and has public meetings so the public could be kept in the loop. She said some careful thought would be needed in building the committee.

It was decided that a single draft of a committee should be drawn up. Ms. McCollem said that once decisions are made, she will do the draft. This will be discussed further at the first June meeting.

9.a. Debrief May 2, 2022, Town Meeting

Ms. McCollem said that this was her first Town Meeting in Bourne, and she asked the Board for their feedback on anything that they would like for her to do differently going forward. She said that they can give her this information whenever they would like to, either individually or as a group.

Ms. Froman said that it was difficult to hear anyone, and would like something done about that, and she thinks that a little bit more information is needed on various articles. Ms. Mastrangelo said that she thinks the meeting went very well overall, though she thinks there were some logistical differences that made it difficult to hear and see presenters. Mr. MacDonald agreed that the meeting went well, and he feels the presenters of the articles should be presented by the Board, Department,

or Committee that has to do with the article, and that they should be very knowledgeable about the article and very prepared to answer questions.

9.b. Tentative date for Fall Town Meeting – October 24

Ms. McCollem said she would like to propose a tentative date of October 24th for the Fall Town Meeting, which will give them plenty of time after Free Cash is certified, and time before the tax rate hearing needs to held. She said she would like the Board to think about this date and as summer approaches she will bring forward the schedule of what needs to happen

9.c. Thank you to the staff for the Arbor Day event on April 30

Ms. McCollem said she wanted to thank the staff, especially on the second floor of Town Hall for their work for the Arbor Day event.

9.d Reminder: Public Hearing – May 18 – Rt. 6 Corridor Improvement Project – virtual on MA-DOT website

Ms. McCollem said that on May 18th there is a virtual hearing on the project for Scenic Highway, the section between Edgehill and Nightingale for lane widening and median work.

9.e. Staffing update

Ms. McCollem said that there is a contract in place for an H.R. Director. Her name is Jessica Rojas, and she will be joining the Town of Bourne on Monday, May 16th. Chair Meier asked about her experience and Ms. McCollem said she is coming from another municipality, and she has extensive municipal and state experience in Human Resources. Ms. Froman asked for a copy of her resume, and Ms. McCollem said she will get it to them.

Ms. McCollem said it does not look like it will work out with the I.T. Director that she had previously told the Board about. It has a lot to do with the housing market and the burden of relocating. She said that Ms. Rojas will re-open that search, once she starts working in Bourne, and she intends to have her advertise at a higher pay level, and no budget adjustment should be needed.

Ms. McCollem said that the job posting for a Police Chief is out and is being advertised currently. The applications and resumes are due back to the search firm on May 31st. After that date, the pool will be narrowed down to a pool that will be invited to respond to several written exercises, then the search firm will review the written exercises, and from there will narrow it down for a group who will meet Ms. McCollem and other Town staff. The finalists will be moved to an all-day assessment center. She hopes to have a name by the middle of July and then start negotiations on the contract.

Ms. McCollem said that she cannot recommend that the Town staff any beaches this summer with lifeguards. She said they have been recruiting heavily since January and people are not able to certify. She does not recommend that they hire anyone as a lifeguard who is not certified, and she also doesn't recommend being short-staffed. She said that the few people that they have been to

find have time constraints where they need extensive time off, and this would leave large gaps in coverage. She said that for this summer at least, the beaches be posted "to be used at your own risk".

Chair Meier said that he is sad that they are hearing it now and he wishes they would have been told earlier. He said that people expect to go to the beach with lifeguards. He recognized that this is a problem everywhere. Ms. Froman said that a certain town nearby called her last week to see if Bourne had extra lifeguards for them. She said that this is a very serious challenge. Ms. McCollem said the pay is competitive and a lot of it has to do with certification and it is not as desirable a job as it once was. Chair Meier asked if it would be possible to offer swimming lessons with fewer lifeguards, and Ms. McCollem said she will ask the few that were certifiable.

Ms. McCollem said that they are working on the Assistant Town Planner and Assistant Library Director positions.

George Slade said that all five pieces of correspondence were from the Department of Environmental addressed to Shawn Cote with the groundwater study impact area at the Joint Base and the Town was cc'd due to being an Upper Cape Town.

12. Committee Reports

Chair Meier said that the Police Building Committee met yesterday and there are still outstanding issues with the building. The issues are with the HVAC and flooring and a few other issues. He said there was a seven-day letter sent out quite a while ago. Town Counsel has recommended giving another 4 to 6 weeks to get all information pulled together to come before the Police Building Committee to see how the issues will be fixed.

Chair Meier also reported that earlier today at the South Side Fire Station Committee meeting, they voted to terminate the contract with the Owners Project Manager and the Architect under the terms of convenience under the contract.

Ms. Froman said that she had an update from MassDOT about the rotary at Belmont Circle. Between now and the end of June they will finish up the sidewalks, lights, curbs, etc. The exception is the loam and seed and drainage punch list items. She also said that Road and Safety Committee is meeting tomorrow.

Ms. Mastrangelo said the Board of Selectmen Policy Subcommittee met in April. She said that she, Mr. Slade, Ms. McCollem, Erica Flemming, and Mike Ellis met to talk about the Financial Policy and Free Cash.

Mr. Slade said there is a meeting tomorrow on the pedestrian bike path. Ms. McCollem said that there is the option of attending the meeting in person or by Zoom.

Ms. Froman took a point of personal privilege to thank Mr. Slade for always being there and always having an answer and for all his years of working for the Town. Ms. Mastrangelo said that she has always enjoyed working with Mr. Slade.

ARTICLE VI

- (a) The Corporation may carry on any business, operation or activity referred to in Article 2 to the same extent as might an individual, whether as principal, agent, contractor or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction or a joint venture or other arrangement with any corporation, association, trust, firm or individual.
- (b) The Corporation may carry on any business, operation or activity through a wholly or partly owned subsidiary.
- (c) The Corporation may be a partner in any business enterprise which it would have power to conduct by itself.
- (d) The directors may make, amend or repeal the by-laws in whole or in part, except with respect to any provision thereof which by law or the by-laws requires action by the stockholders.
- (e) Meeting of the stockholders may be held anywhere in the United States.
- (f) Except as otherwise provided by law, no stockholder shall have any right to examine any property or any books, accounts or other writings of the corporation if there is reasonable ground for belief that such examination will for any reason be adverse to the interests of the corporation, and a vote of the directors refusing permission to make such examination and setting forth that in the opinion of the directors such examination would be adverse to the interests of the corporation shall be prima facie evidence that such examination would be adverse to the interests of the corporation. Every such examination shall be subject to such reasonable regulations as the directors may establish in regard thereto.
- (g) The directors may specify the manner in which the accounts of the corporation shall be kept and may determine what constitutes net earnings, profits and surplus, what amounts, if any, shall be reserved for any corporate purpose, and what amounts, if any, shall be declared as dividends. Unless the board of directors otherwise specifies, the excess of the consideration for any share of its capital stock with par value issued by it over such par value shall be surplus. 

CHAPTER 140 OF THE GENERAL LAWS, TER. ED., WITH AMENDMENTS THERETO (EXTRACT)

Section 57. No person, except one whose principal business is the manufacture and sale of new motor vehicles but who incidentally acquires and sells second hand vehicles, or a person whose principal business is financing the purchase of or insuring motor vehicles but who incidentally acquires and sells second hand vehicles, shall engage in the business of buying, selling, exchanging or assembling second hand motor vehicles or parts thereof without securing a license as provided in section fifty-nine. This section shall apply to any person engaged in the business of conducting auctions for the sale of motor vehicles.

Section 58. Licenses granted under the following section shall be classified as follows:


- Class 1. Any person who is a recognized agent of a motor vehicle manufacturer or a seller of motor vehicles made by such manufacturer whose authority to sell the same is created by a written contract with such manufacturer or with some person authorized in writing by such manufacturer to enter into such contract, and whose prinicpal business is the sale of new motor vehicles, the purchase and sale of second hand motor vehicles being incidental or secondary thereto, may be granted an agent's or a seller's license; provided, that with respect to second hand motor vehicles purchased for the purpose of sale or exchange and not taken in trade for new motor vehicles, such dealer shall be subject to all provisions of this chapter and of rules and regulations made in accordance therewith applicable to holders of licenses of class 2.
- Class 2. Any person whose principal business is the buying or selling of second hand motor vehicles may be granted a used car dealer's license.
- Class 3. Any person whose principal business is the buying of second hand motor vehicles for the purpose of remodeling, taking apart or rebuilding the same, or the buying or selling of parts of second hand motor vehicles or tires, or the assembling of second hand motor vehicle parts, may be granted a motor vehicle junk license.

SECTION 59. The police commissioner in Boston and the licensing authorities in other cities and towns may grant licenses under this section which will expire on January first following the date of issue unless sooner revoked. The fees for the licenses shall be fixed by the licensing board or officer, but in no case shall exceed \$100. Selectmen,

As per MGL Chap 130 Sec 60, this Public Hearing was duly advertised in a local newspaper, The Cape Cod Times, on April 26, 2022 and a Notice of Public hearing was posted in three public places, Town Hall and two Post Offices (Buzzards Bay & Pocasset) on April 26, 2022. The 16 abutters to this proposed aquaculture grant have been notified. The abutters were notified by Certified Mail on April 30, 2022.

I have reviewed and support the application submitted on March 4, 2022 by Mr. Lang Allen of 59 Elgin Rd., for the location of the (Nantucket Sound Bay Scallop Company 18 Wings Neck Rd.), Pocasset, MA 02559 for the aquaculture operation at the Scallop Bay Marina. The application is simply to license the hatchery and nursery production to Mr. Allen, with **no increase in area to be farmed, and no change to the floats, upwellers or hatchery footprint**. Mr. Allen would like to add the ability to grow eastern oysters (*Crassostrea virginica*) and quahogs (*Mercenaria mercenaria*) to the permit, in addition to the previously approved bay scallop (*Argopecten irradians*) aquaculture. All of the bay scallops, oysters, and quahogs farmed in the Pocasset River will contribute to reducing the nitrogen concentration of the river, and will help to improve water quality of the river and the surrounding water bodies.




Figure 1. Floating downweller. The shellfish grown in the Pocasset River will be grown under the existing docks in stacked trays like in the pictured system.

Mr. Allen is applying for a permit to perform commercial aquaculture activities including the existing commercial shellfish hatchery in the existing building and to locate the same floating upwellers, downwellers and trays within and under the existing previously permitted dock systems. All hatchery production will occur within the existing building at the Scallop Bay Marina, 18 Wings Neck Rd., Pocasset, MA 02559. The nursery system will include floating upwellers, floating downwellers, and hanging trays located under the existing floats. Floating upwellers are known within the aquaculture industry as FLUPSYs (Floating Upweller SYstems), which protect fragile juvenile shellfish (bay scallops), and help increase food (microalgae) passing by the growing shellfish. The shellfish are transferred from a hatchery at approximately 1 mm (about the size of a grain of sand). Up to 1 million shellfish are then placed within the 8 bays of the upweller, where they are grown until approximately ½-1", when they can then be sold or transferred to the grow out site (Fig. 1).

Licenses will be issued only to dominciled residents of the Town of Bourne who have the knowledge, experience, and resources to fulfill the responsibilities specified in the license. This operation will help meet the demand for seed by local growers located in the Southeastern Mass and Cape and Islands areas. Mr. Allen has been working with the principals of the Nantucket Sound Bay Scallop Company since July of 2018, and has been involved with aquaculture planning, permitting and development throughout that period. Mr. Allen has been a Town of Bourne resident for 76 years, and has harvested quahogs and oysters in the Town of Bourne waters for several decades. He has extensive experience in shellfish harvesting, and will bring his knowledge of bay scallop farming to Bourne.

There would be no impacts to any public recreational water activites at this location. The bottom of the proposed area is not currently conducive to shellfish growth or survival, and therefore the water column above the poor quality bottom would be ideal to avoid conflicts with commercial and recreational shellfishermen.

Unlike a permit for growing shellfish on the bottom in tidal areas, this method of shellfish propagation would not require the approval of the Bourne Conservation Commission.

The public hearing for this proposed permit was duly advertised in the Cape Cod Times on April 26, 2022. For your reference I have included the State Aquaculture Statute and local Aquaculture Regulations and Procedures.

AQUACULTURE LICENSES / SHELLFISH GRANTS

Rules & Regulations & Application Requirements

At a regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen held on December 6, 2011 the following rules and regulations were adopted covering Aquaculture Licenses and Shellfish Grants.

- 8.1 The Board of Selectmen may license specific areas of the waters of the Town of Bourne to individuals for the purpose of granting exclusive rights to plant, grow, and take shellfish from that area, said license to be subject to the provisions of MGL Ch. 130, Sec. 57 and any terms, conditions, and/or restrictions set forth in the regulations of the State, Town, its By-laws, or any specific conditions or restrictions set forth in the license. Applicants shall be considered on a first come first serve basis. The Board of Selectmen may deny a license or establish a moratorium on the issuance of licenses at any time this action is deemed to be in the best interest of the Town.
- 8.2 Licenses will be issued only to domiciled residents of the Town of Bourne who have the knowledge, experience, and resources to fulfill the responsibilities specified in the license. The applicant shall furnish evidence of residency as part of the application process. Said evidence to include, but not necessarily be limited to, the following: a current motor vehicle driver's license issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, a valid, current real estate tax bill issued by the Town of Bourne, and evidence of current ownership or tenancy by rental of real estate of a primary residence within the Town of Bourne. At such time as a licensee ceases to be domiciled in the Town of Bourne, it is the responsibility of the licensee to notify the Board of Selectmen of this change of residence. The Board of Selectmen will then remove the name of that individual from the license. This permit shall not be sold or transferred without written permission from the Board of Selectmen.
- 8.3 The Board of Selectmen will accept and process applications for aquaculture licenses in accordance with MGL 130, Sec 57. Applicants desiring a shellfish grant are required to complete and submit all information required by the Town's application form. Applicants shall also furnish a detailed proposal to include short term and long term plans for developing the Aquaculture/Grant site. Proposals must include shellfish species, amounts and sizes intended to introduce to the waters. Must also include the number of racks, pens, cages, floats, etc. that you

intend to use and their dimensions. Applicant must also provide detailed information regarding their experience with aquaculture. Licenses will be granted or denied within sixty days of receipt of application.

- 8.4 This license does not grant any property rights. This license does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private property rights. The issuance of this license is not a determination of title or ownership.
- 8.5 The initial term for a new license will be two (2) years. The term for renewals will be two (2) years. Renewal will be subject to approval of the Board of Selectmen and any other appropriate and /or required governing bodies as set forth by Chapter 130 Section 60 of M.G.L. License holder must show that a reasonable amount of shellfish have been produced on the grant during the preceding year. This amount shall not be less than what is required in Chapter 130 Section 65 of M.G.L.
- 8.6 Licenses will be issued for a one (1) acre maximum the first year. Once planted and established, licensee can apply for more acreage if the lease demonstrates productivity and the capability to expand.
- 8.7 Means of harvesting shellfish from the approved grant area will be limited to the use of quahog rake, tongs, scuba gear or conventional scallop dredge unless specific written approval to use other means is obtained from the Board of Selectmen and the shellfish constable. Harvesting will not take place between the hours of one half hour after sunset and one half hour before sunrise.
- 8.8 The placement of moorings and ground tackle for rafts, racks and floats, or any other structure will be subject to approval from the Harbormaster, Conservation Commission and the Corps of Engineers. Rafts and racks may or may not be approved for the grant area (depending on the location of the specific site). Shellfish will not be rafted outside the perimeters of the approved grant area without written permission from the Harbormaster and Shellfish Constable.
- 8.9 It will be unlawful for the Grant-Holder or any person to take seed shellfish from any waterways or flats of the Town other than the designated grant area without written consent to do so from the Selectmen and the Director of the Division of Marine Fisheries.
- 8.10 The Shellfish constable and / or his assistants, in the presence of the permit holder or his agent, will have authority to inspect the Grant area to include the contents of any and all rafts, floats and other containers.
- 8.11 If in any given year, it is determined by the Shellfish Constable that there is a marketable concentration of scallops in the grant area, then it will be the responsibility of the Grant-Holder to relocate said scallops to an area designated by the Shellfish Constable. The Grant-Holder by agreement with the Shellfish Constable may elect to allow the harvesting of scallops by licensed members of the general public upon his grant area for the sole purpose of harvesting scallops by either dip netting or dragging. If the grant-Holder elects to allow the harvesting of scallops

upon his grant a mutually agreed time period, method of taking, etc. shall be specifically established to permit this by the Grant-Holder, the Shellfish Constable and the Board of Selectmen.

- 8.12 If at any time it becomes necessary to dredge and / or otherwise accomplish maintenance dredging on or within the vicinity of the grant area to improve or maintain channels for navigation purposes the Grant-Holder will agree under terms of the contract not to obstruct said dredging plans and operations. The Grant-Holder will be given 90 days notice prior to commencement of any dredging operations. Prior to, during and after dredging operations are completed and if in the opinion of the Grant-Holder, the Shellfish Constable and the State Marine biologist, that said bottom conditions are considered temporarily unsuitable for planting or maintaining shellfish, immediate and temporary permission for relocation of Grant-Holders stock shall be considered by the Board of Selectmen. All the foregoing regulations shall apply to any temporary placement of said shellfish. In the event that shellfish need to be relocated under these conditions they shall be relocated at the expense of the Grant-Holder.
- 8.13 When a Grant is discontinued and / or terminated for any reason, the Permit Holder will be required to remove all rafts, racks, floats, boxes, pens, boundary markers and equipment from the waters and substrate within 90 days from the Grant expiration date. In addition, the Permit Holder will be required to provide proof of a General Liability Insurance Policy in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 naming the Town of Bourne as an additional insured.
- 8.14 Written permission must be obtained from the Board of Selectmen, the Shellfish constable and the Conservation Commission prior to any alterations being made in or on the ground area of the Grant that were not made part of the initial Grant application.
- 8.15 The Grant-Holder will be required to hold a Town of Bourne Commercial Permit and required state permits to handle seed and propagate shellfish in compliance with the MGL Chapter 130. The Grant-Holder will be required to comply with all rules and regulations governing shellfish and grants as forth by the Town of Bourne and MGL Chapter 130, Section 57 thru 68 and MGL Chapter 131, Section 40. Failure to comply with the aforementioned laws and regulations will be deemed cause to revoke the Grant Permit.
- 8.16 If the Grant sites are approved, the applicant must have the grant site(s) surveyed at his own expense and submit a recorded plan of the specified grant area to the Board of Selectmen. The survey and the plan must be completed by a registered engineer or surveyor and the plan must be stamped accordingly. Boundaries of said Grant must be clearly identified by plastic pipe, wooden posts or floatation buoys and shall be subject to inspection and approval by the Harbormaster. Type and specific location of said boundary markers shall be shown on the plan prepared by the registered engineer or surveyor. As a minimum at least each corner of the grant area shall be marked by a boundary marker. A sign indicating the Grant permit number and name of the grant-Holder must be displayed on each corner post in compliance with MGL Chapter 130, Section 61. A sign indicating the Grant permit number and name of the grant-Holder must be displayed on each vessel moored or working within the boundaries of the approved grant.

8.17 Fees

- a) An advertising fee of \$125 for the public hearing shall be payable at the time of submitting the application form.
- b) Permit An annual permit fee of \$25 per acre (or any part thereof) payable at time of Grant approval and then upon renewal of each year shall be required.

8.18 Grant Approval

The approval of this Grant shall be subject to the following:

- a. Any legal appeal process as outlined by the MGL Chapter 130 or Chapter 131 and/or any other law which may apply.
- b. Federal, State and Local laws, rules and regulations and amendments thereto.
- c. Annual review by the Board of Selectmen as stipulated by Town Regulations.
- d. State certification in compliance with Chapter 130, Section 61.
- e. Receipt of survey and plan stamped by a registered engineer or surveyor in compliance with section 61 of chapter 130 and local regulations.
- 8.19 Any violation of these rules and regulations or amendments shall be subject to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Part I ADMINISTRATION OF THE GOVERNMENT

Title XIX AGRICULTURE AND CONSERVATION

Chapter MARINE FISH AND FISHERIES

130

Section 57 SHELLFISH AQUACULTURE LICENSES

Section 57. The city council or mayor of any city, or the selectmen of any town, may upon written application, accompanied by plans sufficient to show the intended project and project area to be licensed, and after public notice and hearing pursuant to section sixty, grant to any person a shellfish aquaculture license.

Said license shall authorize said licensee in such city or town at all times of the year, in, upon, or from a specific portion of coastal waters of the commonwealth, of tidal flats or land under coastal waters: (1) to plant and grow shellfish, bottom/off bottom culture; (2) to place shellfish in or under protective devices affixed directly to the tidal flats or land under coastal waters, such as boxes, trays, pens, bags, or nets; (3) to harvest and take legal shellfish; (4) to plant cultch for the purpose of catching shellfish seed; and (5) to grow shellfish by means of racks, rafts or floats.

After receipt of a written application by the city council or selectmen, and after the notice and public hearing requirements of this section are satisfied and the licensing authority approves the application, the director shall, after inspection of the intended project area, certify that issuance of a shellfish aquaculture license and operation thereunder will cause no substantial adverse effect on the shellfish or other natural resources of the city or town. Upon such certification by the director, the city council or selectmen may issue the license, provided, however, that no license shall be issued for any areas then or within two years prior thereto, closed for municipal cultivation under the provisions of section fifty-four. Failure of the director to so certify shall be deemed a denial of the shellfish aquaculture license. The director's certification or refusal to certify shall be reviewable in accordance with section fourteen of chapter thirty A.

Licenses under this section shall be granted or denied in writing within sixty days after receipt of the written application and shall be issued upon forms supplied by such cities and towns and upon such terms and conditions and subject to such terms, conditions or regulations as the city council or selectmen issuing the same shall deem proper, but not so as to impair the private rights of any person or to materially obstruct navigable waters, and said license shall describe by metes and bounds the waters, flats or creeks covered thereby. Shellfish aquaculture licenses pursuant to this section shall be subject to any rules and regulations promulgated by the director, including those concerning the use and scope of predator controls in the intertidal zone, and said licenses may be further conditioned by the director as he deems necessary and appropriate, including species to be propagated and the source and movement of seed shellfish.

Said license shall be for a period of not more than ten years and may be renewed for similar periods. Said license may be revoked by the city council, selectmen or the director for failure to comply with any terms, conditions or regulations set forth by these entities, or for lack of substantial use of the licensed area. Said licensee shall have the right to the exclusive use of the lands and waters for the purposes of growing shellfish thereon, and the licensee shall plainly mark the boundaries of said area. The selectmen or city council shall permit, as a condition of the license, such public uses of said waters and lands as are compatible with the aquacultural enterprise.

Whoever without the consent of the licensee, unless otherwise permitted by the terms and conditions of said license: (1) takes shellfish from the licensed lands or waters or from said racks, rafts or floats; (2) disturbs the licensed area or the growth of the shellfish thereon in any way; (3) discharges any substance which may directly or indirectly injure the shellfish; (4) willfully injures, defaces, destroys, removes or trespasses upon said racks, rafts, or floats; or (5) willfully injures, defaces, destroys, removes or trespasses upon said protective devices affixed directly to the tidal flats, such as boxes, trays, pens, bags, or nets shall be liable in tort for treble damages and costs to the licensee injured by such act.

Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the validity, conditions, or terms of any license granted under the corresponding provisions of earlier laws and in full force upon the effective date of this section. Nothing in this section shall excuse the licensee from complying with other laws of the commonwealth, including environmental laws and laws concerning interference with navigation.

Said shellfish aquaculture license may be transferred pursuant to section fifty-eight and all rights and privileges enjoyed by the licensee shall be assumed by the transferee.

Any license issued under the provisions of this section shall, upon the death of the licensee, continue in full force and effect, subject to the same terms, conditions, and regulations imposed upon the original license, for the balance of the unexpired term, or one year whichever is longer, for the use of the members of the immediate family of the deceased licensee. For the purposes of this section, immediate family shall mean the spouse, son, daughter, mother, father, brother and sister of said deceased licensee.

Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the validity, conditions, or term of any license granted under corresponding provisions of earlier laws and in full force upon the effective date of this section.

Chair Meier welcomed all to the Town of Bourne Public Hearing on the Comcast Cable License Renewal. He said that notice of this hearing was posted in the local newspaper twice in two successive weeks and copies of the legal advertisements are entered into the record as hearing exhibits 1 and 2.

Attorney August said he is Cable Counsel to the Town in this renewal and in years past. He said he is confident with this renewal license and with what was negotiated on behalf of the Town. It secures Bourne TV's operating budget for the next 10 years. He said that the Cable Committee generated very detailed ascertained findings and Bourne TV submitted very detailed reports showing a lot of growth in local programming. Comcast agreed to the Town's demands of increasing the budget and the equipment grant. Comcast also agreed to provide at their own expense, \$30,000. Of equipment to upgrade the resolution and picture quality. He said that Bourne is getting a fourth channel.

Voted: Judy Froman moved, and George Slade seconded to open the Public Hearing

Vote: 4-0-0.

Rob Frangieh, Chairman of the Cable Advisory Committee, thanked Comcast and said they were great with negotiating the renewal. He said the highlight of the negotiation is that Bourne is going from 3.5% annually to 5%, which is the federal maximum. He talked about the new equipment that they will be getting and service levels. Ms. Froman asked about certain areas of Bourne and if Comcast said that the service levels are where they should be, if an individual is having issues

should they get in touch with Comcast themselves, and Mr. Frangieh said yes, as it could be their individual line.

Jen McGrail, Director of Operations, Bourne TV, thanked all involved for their hard work in negotiating the license renewal, on behalf of everyone at Bourne TV. Gary Maloney asked about the amount cable subscribers in Bourne, and Attorney August said that it is close to 8,000 subscribers.

Voted: Judy Froman moved, and Mary Jane Mastrangelo seconded to close the Public Hearing. **Roll Call Vote:** Mary Jane Mastrangelo – yes, Judy Froman – yes, George Slade – yes, and Chair Meier – yes.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Judy Froman seconded that the cable franchise renewal proposal of Comcast reasonably meets the franchise and cable-related renewal needs and interests of the public and the Town of Bourne; and finding that Comcast's financial and technical qualifications and local programming channels, facilities, and services are reasonable to meet Town cable franchise needs.

Roll Call Vote: Mary Jane Mastrangelo – yes, Judy Froman – yes, George Slade – yes, and Chair Meier – yes.

Vote: 4-0-0.

8.b. Discussion and possible vote on the request from J.C. Engineering for vehicular access over 280 Standish Road (39 Phillips Road applicant).

A representative from J.C. Engineering, representing the applicant, presented the request for vehicular access over 280 Standish Road. He said they recently received a conservation permit to do some dune nourishment on the property, which was restored about 7 or 8 years ago. He said approximately 10 to 15 feet of the dunes have been lost during the last few years. He said that due to the number of structures and retaining walls on the site, access needs to be over the beach at 280 Standish Road.

Ms. Froman asked what type of equipment would be used to transport the sand to the area. He said that the contractor would be using a rock truck, which looks like a dump truck, but it has wide rubber tires, and it is suitable to cross over the cobble and sand beach, and they will be using an excavator. He said time is crucial also because of the piping plovers, and when the best time to do plantings. There was more discussion about the equipment and wear and tear on the ramp.

Ms. Mastrangelo asked about the Order of Conditions, and he said that the Order of Conditions states that any conditions put on by this Board are part of that order. Ms. Froman would like to see some type of conditions added. Ms. Mastrangelo said that she feels that there should be specific language provided by Town Counsel.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Judy Froman seconded to continue this to the meeting of March 22, 2022, so the Board of Selectmen can work with Town Counsel and the DPW Superintendent for a proper motion.

Vote: 4-0-0.

8.c. Discussion and possible vote relative to the Calamar construction project (The Tides at Bourne). Jerry Hill (Executive Vice President of Calamar) will update the Select Board relative to recent construction activities, an estimated completion date, and the status of the affordable units.

Chair Meier said that the last time Jerry Hill met with the Board of Selectmen, the project had been shut down and they have since met with the Building Inspector and the project is now back up and running. Mr. Hill said that the stop order was lifted a few days after that Board of Selectmen meeting. Mr. Hill said that they are working closely with the Bourne Building Department on some paperwork and questions that the Building Department had.

Mr. Hill said that they will be turning the building over to their operations people sometime in September and that is when the residents will be able to move in. He said that the leasing department had a meeting in which all residents were invited to attend either in person or by Zoom, and they had an almost 100% attendance rate, and the residents were updated.

Mr. Hill said that 12 units will be for lower-income residents. The building is completely closed in now. Chair Meier asked if the rental manager could come to the next meeting because future residents of these units are nervous and concerned. Mr. Hill said that all residents have been contacted in some way in the past few weeks. There was some discussion on the number of covered parking spots and about when the parking lot will be finished.

Chair Meier said that this project is hindering other projects and other properties that are up for sale. Mr. Cannon asked if they have worked out the issues with drainage and he said that they are working on the issues. Mr. Hill said that he wishes Mr. Cannon well in his new position and that he has been a pleasure to work with during this project.

8.d. Discussion and possible vote relative to the disposition of Real Property – the Old Police Station.

Chair Meier said that Town Meeting gave the authorization to do what is best for the interest of the Town. He said the Town has a few options: retain it for municipal use by either tearing the building down and having an empty lot, dispose of the property with the building on it or dispose of the land once the building has been demolished. He asked the Board for their thoughts.

Ms. Mastrangelo said that in 2009 after the Cecil Report was done, they had a highest and best use analysis done. She said that obviously, it is outdated, and she thinks that before any decisions are made there should be a similar study done on this property. Ms. Froman agreed. Mr. Slade said it would help to get some additional planning expertise. Ms. Mastrangelo said that a market analysis should be part of the highest and best use study.

8.e. Discussion and possible vote relative to the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget and Fiscal Year 2023 Capital Plan.

Erice Flemming said that there are some budget adjustments related to the FY23 proposed budget that was last amended on February 1, 2022. She said overall they recommend a budget reduction in the amount of \$98,937. This will bring the total general fund operating budget to \$73,393,416., which is approximately a 2.3% increase over the prior year.

Ms. Flemming then gave a summary of the adjustments. She said the first two adjustments relate to the IT Dept. salaries, which is a reduction of \$35,299. There is an increase of \$400. for Conservation for the protective clothing allowance. There is a \$75,000. decrease to the Police Patrolmen's salary line. There is a decrease in the Upper Cape Tech Assessment and in the Board of Health salaries. They increased all budget appropriations by 20% for fuel. The total increase in the general fund for fuel is \$128,320. The Sewer increase for Fuel is \$700. and ISWM was increased by 33,700.

Ms. Flemming said to offset these adjustments they reduced the ambulance receipts reserve for appropriation. They offset the increase in marina gasoline. There was a \$75,000 decrease in miscellaneous occurring receipts. They reduced motor vehicle excise by \$18,937. There was some discussion on the operating costs for the Water Treatment Facility, the IT Department positions, and about the County IT team.

Ms. Mastrangelo said that the Community building being part of the Facilities budget needs to be looked at. Town Administrator McCollem said that she and Mike Ellis have been talking about having a way to show the costs of all the buildings in Facilities and to have them seen on one page and to have it clearly denote this building.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Judy Froman seconded to approve the updated fiscal 2023 budget and revised sources and uses.

Ms. McCollem said that the Board of Appeals is taking a recess in June, and she just wants the public to be aware.

Ms. McCollem said that there is a TIP project for about a mile and a half starting at Nightingale Road to Edgehill Road for widening, drainage improvements, and a shared-use path. The next step would be a Public Hearing. She said the MassDOT is coordinating the work with the canal area work. She said regarding the boring investigation for about a dozen sites on either side of the canal, the contractor could be mobilizing as early as this Thursday.

9.d. The Town Administrator will discuss the strategic plan, annual goals, and the Board's priorities.

Chair Meier said that he usually doesn't have this as a discussion point so early, but since Ms. McCollem came on so early, he thought that some direction can be given at the meetings regarding the strategic plan. Ms. McCollem said she appreciates this and feels it will be helpful to her and valuable to everyone. She talked about the planning of goals and objectives moving forward together. Ms. Mastrangelo said that she thinks a workshop would be a good idea to have sometime in April to go over the strategic plan and goals and objectives.

Mr. Cannon said that he was totally invested in Bourne even before coming to Bourne because of his time on the Cape Cod Commission. He said that his four years in Bourne have been very exciting, and it was wonderful working in the Town, with the Board of Selectmen, and with the Department Heads. He said he will take the knowledge that he gained in Bourne into his position in Rochester. Mr. Ellis thanked Mr. Cannon and wished him well in his new position. Ms. Flemming said that Mr. Cannon has been her steady for the past four years, and he will be missed.

Ms. Froman said that they had a Roadway Safety Committee meeting this past week and they reorganized the committee so that Tim Lydon is now the Chair and Sean Patterson is the Vice-Chair. They now have a clerk, Mandy Holway, and it was Rich Libin's first meeting. She said they decided that they will meet every other month. They discussed grasslands and no parking signs. This committee will be a proactive committee.

Leona Bombaci introduced herself and said she is from Pocasset. She said she is the Bourne contact for the Coalition to Save the Bay of Massachusetts and the Downwinders, which is Cape wide organization that has been addressing the issues that have been the result of the Pilgrim Nuclear Power Station in Plymouth. Ms. Bombaci said that she gathered over 25 signatures for this non-binding public advisory question for the 2022 sprint Town ballot.

The question is calling upon Holtec Pilgrim LLC, owner of the closed Pilgrim Nuclear Power Station and Holtec Decommissioning International LLC, to immediately withdraw any plans to discharge any radioactive water into Cape Cod Bay. She explained that Cape Cod Bay is a federal and state-protected habitat for the endangered Right Whale and provides a vital livelihood for fishermen and the tourist industry. She said the National Academies of Science has determined that there is no safe dose of ionized radiation.

She also said that the question on the ballot would allow the people of Bourne to direct the local government to communicate with Governor Charlie Baker, Attorney General Maura Healey, and the State Legislature to employ all means available to ensure that Holtec commits to immediately withdraw any plans to dump any radioactive water into Cape Cod Bay. She said the goal is to get citizen approval. She has information for anyone that would like it, and she can point anyone to the websites that have more information.

Ms. Mastrangelo told Ms. Bombaci that the Board did write letters to many people about this as well. She said she was in favor of putting this on the ballot. Mr. Slade said that he appreciates Ms. Bombaci bringing this to the Board. He said it is a good thing and it's good to keep it a high profile. The rest of the board was in favor, as well as the Town Clerk, Barry Johnson.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Judy Froman seconded to place a Non-Binding Public Advisory Question on the 2022 Spring Town Ballot, on the petition of Leona Bombaci, calling upon Holtec Pilgrim, LLC, owner of the closed Pilgrim Nuclear Power Station and Holtec Decommissioning International, LLC, to immediately withdraw any plans to discharge any radioactive water into Cape Cod Bay.

Vote: 5-0-0.

9.b. Shared Spaces Grant presentation for the West end of Main Street (Tim Lydon & Environmental Partners).

Shawn Patterson, DPW Director, said that as discussed at a previous meeting, there are three major intersections that were discussed. He said that he, Tim Lydon, and Environmental Partners met to discuss doing something on Main Street to tie the intersection into the park as well as the marina, to make it all cohesive.

Jim Fitzgerald of Environmental Partners showed a slide presentation of the Main Street and Academy Drive Intersection Improvements Project. He said there are several goals of this project and some of them are to improve pedestrian and ADA accommodations, provide a gateway to Main Street, reduce vehicular speeds, and provide community gathering spaces. He said it is their hope that most of the project be funded through the Shared Streets and Spaces grant through MassDOT. The grant was submitted by the Town on March 1st, 2022, and they anticipate hearing back from MassDOT by April 15th, regarding funding. If this funding is awarded, then construction would have to be done by June of 2023.

Margot Schoenfelder of Environmental Partners went into more detail about the project. She talked about the number of crosswalks and the parking spots along Main Street. She also talked about being ADA compliant. She talked about colored texturized pavement to alert drivers they are entering a busy area. She said they are proposing some curb extensions.

Chair Meier asked about adding lighting on a temporary basis. Mr. Patterson said that it has been discussed and they have talked about getting funding for lights and they may have to use Chapter 90 money to do it on a permanent basis, and there is not a solution for temporary lighting. Ms. Froman said she thinks that a temporary fix is needed so motorists can see people that are on the crosswalks. Mr. MacDonald said that something needs to be done to slow people down after going through the rotary to Main Street. There was some more discussion on how to slow the traffic down and about expanding the project.

9.c. Continued discussion and possible vote on the request from J.C. Engineering for vehicular access over 280 Standish Road (39 Phillips Road, LLC applicant).

Brad Bertolo of J.C. Engineering said he was there to give a quick review on behalf of the applicant. He said the applicant got a permit from the Conservation Commission to restore an eroding dune and they are looking for access across the beach and the boat ramp that is located at about 600 feet to the north, which would be over town property. He said that since last week's meeting he has received a draft license agreement that seems appropriate and he is hoping that it can be discussed and possibly voted on.

Chair Meier said that yes, there is a temporary license that Town Administrator McCollem and Town Counsel have put together. Ms. McCollem said that if it is voted affirmatively tonight, then she will fill in the blank dates with the correct information and if it is moved as prepared, then she and the applicant can make sure it is in place.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Jared MacDonald seconded (1) grant a temporary, revocable construction access license to 39 Phillips Road, LLC, for access to the Town's property known and numbered as 280 Standish Road in the form and on the terms set forth in the Access License Agreement presented to the Board; (2) delegate all necessary authority to the Town Administrator to execute said Agreement on behalf of the Town; and (3) delegate all necessary authority to the Town Administrator to take any act or exercise any authority conferred on or reserved to the town by the provisions of said Agreement.

Roll Call Vote: Mary Jane Mastrangelo – yes – yes, Judy Froman – yes, Jared MacDonald - yes, George Slade – yes, and Chair Meier – yes.

Vote: 5-0-0.

9.d. Discussion and possible vote relative to the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget and Fiscal Year 2023 Capital Plan.

Ms. McCollem said that she has a few updates to provide to the board that were questioned at the last meeting. She said that the bills for the electric line for the Wastewater Treatment Plant have been approximately \$600. a month. She said that they will be coming before the Board to recommend a budget adjustment at the Spring Town Meeting, and they are working on what the amount should be.

Ms. McCollem said that they are also working to see if they can amend the Town's energy agreement as it was signed before the Wastewater Treatment Plant was online. They are looking to add the location to the agreement and lock in a lower rate for the power going to the Treatment Plant.

Regarding the fuel contracts, Ms. McCollem said that they are looking into them and gathering information. Once she has a full report, she will get back to the board for any questions.

Ms. McCollem said there was some discussion about how they are showing and organizing the budget for the Community building. She said the proposed budget for FY23 had taken the Community building budget and rolled it into Facilities. She said that they have been working on a different way of showing it to the Board, and she brought copies of the new way and passed them around to the Board. She said it is a budget sheet for the Facilities Department and there are two project areas now within the budget, and the rest of the budget falls underneath. Ms. Mastrangelo said that this sheet is exactly what they need, and she is pleased with the new presentation of the Facilities budget. Chair Meier asked for a copy to be emailed to him.

Chair Meier asked about the professional support staff being cut to two full-time equivalents in the Selectmen/Town Administrator's office. He said that it means that the part-time individual's position will be cut. He said that he thinks that where Ms. McCollem is new that she should keep that position for the time being and give it some time to see what she would like to do regarding the staff in the office. Ms. McCollem said that she has not had a lot of time to observe the day-to-day in the office. She also said that the proposed budget that was given to the board by Mr. Cannon was an increase to include 3 full-time positions. She said that she is fine with how the board would like to proceed. Mr. Slade said that he feels the time is needed to figure out the staffing, and Ms. Froman agrees. Ms. McCollem said she would be more comfortable if the budget reflects how the positions will be filled. There was more discussion about the positions and funding.

Voted: George Slade moved, and Mary Jane Mastrangelo seconded to amend the FY2023 operating budget to reflect two full-time and one part-time administrative staff in the Town Administrator/Selectmen's Office.

Vote: 5-0-0.

9.e. Continued discussion and possible vote regarding the draft May 2, 2022, Annual Town Meeting Warrant.

Ms. McCollem said she still has more work to do, and she hopes to have another version to the board by the end of the week after Counsel has reviewed it. She would like any additional feedback to be sent to her. Ms. Mastrangelo the draft that she saw looked good, but she was wondering about ESCO. Ms. McCollem is working with Dr. Quinlan-Zhou on the ESCO article.

9.f. Discussion and possible vote to accept a gift of white oak seedlings for Arbor Day.

Chair Meier said the Conservation Department would like to accept this donation for the town and they would like to work with the DPW, the Engineering Department, the Department of Natural Resources, and local volunteers to plant these trees in appropriate locations throughout the town. He also wanted to thank Stephanie Fitch for her work with this and for what she has done for the town thus far.

Voted: Judy Froman moved, and Mary Jane Mastrangelo seconded to accept 100 white oak saplings as a gift from the Falmouth Unitarian Universalist Church and other environmental organizations in celebration of Arbor Day and to further direct the Town Administrator to coordinate the planting of the trees in appropriate locations on Town-Owned land.

Vote: 5-0-0.

9.g. Discussion and possible vote to accept a \$300 donation to the library.

Chair Meier said thank you to the Wheelers for their donation.

Voted: Judy Froman moved, and George Slade seconded to accept a gift from Fred and Dorothy Wheeler of Pocasset in the amount of \$300.00 for the Jonathan Bourne Public Library.

9.h. Discussion and possible vote to reconstitute the *Traffic Advisory Committee*.

Chair Meier said that the former Chair of the Traffic Advisory Committee feels that it is time to reactivate the committee due to the canal bridges, the work going on from Belmont Circle to Edgehill Road, and the possibility of MBTA, the Bourne Rail Trail, and other transportation projects. Chair Meier said that they should go over the Executive Order. Ms. Froman said that it should be changed to Charge of the Committee, rather than Executive Order, and the rest of the board agreed.

Mr. Slade said that this group could be the contact group for the bridges, and to obviously have a Select Board member on the committee. Chair Meier said that the charge says that the committee shall consist of 9 members including The Chief of Police or their designee, the DPW Director, a representative of the Cape Cod Commission, a Planning Board representative, and four other members, all appointed by the Board of Selectmen. They are all one-year terms following the Fiscal Year schedule. Chair Meier said that the Board should look this charge over, submit any suggested changes to the Town Administrator, and this will be on the agenda of the April 5, 2022, meeting.

9.i. Discussion and possible vote to allow Bourne Historical Society the requested surplus chairs currently located at Hoxie School.

Voted: Jared MacDonald moved, and Mary Jane Mastrangelo seconded to allow the Bourne Historical Society to remove up to 75 plastic, stackable chairs from the surplus equipment stored at the Hoxie School.

Vote: 4-0-1. Chair Meier abstained.

10. Town Administrator

a. Update on staffing and vacant positions.

10.a. Update on staffing and vacant positions.

Ms. McCollem said she has been busy putting together a plan to fill the vacant positions in the Town of Bourne and she wanted to give an update. She said that she has held interviews for the I.T. Manager, and she has extended a verbal offer to one of the candidates. She has held interviews for the Town Planner position and she and the panel have agreed that the internal candidate, Jennifer Copeland, is the most qualified applicant. Ms. McCollem has offered her the permanent position of Town Planner and she has accepted. She said the Assistant Town Planner will be backfilled when Ms. Copeland is ready to staff the position.

Ms. McCollem said she has interviews scheduled for the Library Director and the H.R. Director. She said there is an RFP out and available to the public for an Assessment Center to identify a Police Chief candidate. She said the responses from the consulting forms are due back to her on April 8th. Once the responses are received, a panel will rate and review them, and she will contract with an assessment firm to hold an assessment center to develop a list of names to interview for Police Chief.

Ms. McCollem said she has reviewed and made some slight adjustments to the job description for the Assistant Town Administrator, and it has not been advertised yet and will be soon. She said once these positions are filled, she will take a step back to assess what is outstanding and vacant and move forward with getting the Town's staff to its full complement.

Chair Meier asked about the Facilities Director position. Ms. McCollem said she is meeting with both Mr. Feeney and Mr. Patterson on Thursday to discuss if it makes sense to have Facilities be a stand-alone department. There was some discussion about facilities being part of the DPW with one department and having a separate Director and Department and about the Assistant Town Administrator position.

Mr. Slade asked about the Library Director and the H.R. Director positions and if Ms. McCollem is handling interviews herself or with others. Ms. McCollem said she is putting together panels for interviewing for both positions, and there are two of the Library Trustees on the panel for the Library Director position.

11. Correspondence

Mr. Slade listed the correspondence

- Talent Bank Form from Toni Dearing with interest in being on the Bourne Historical Commission.
- A letter from Leonard Pinot from Mass DEP to Rose Forbes at the Joint Base Cape Cod with the status of clean-up issues that occurred in April of 2000.

- Letter from Elizabeth Liddell with a list of grant projects from the last 11 years and an invoice for the town's share of the maintenance.

• Letter from Dan Cordeaux of the State Office of Planning with its interest in leasing space within 20 miles of the bridges for classroom and physical training for the Regional Police Academy.

Chair Meier said that they received an invitation today from Senator Markey's office for this Saturday to meet the Senator to tour Mass Maritime.

12. Committee Reports –

Judy Froman said she had a Cape Cod Metropolitan Planning Organization meeting on Monday and several items were discussed. They are in the process of improving and having to endorse their public participation plan. She said they also discussed the Unified Planning Work Program. They also are currently in the middle of making an amendment to the TIP for projects in Orleans and Mashpee. They also discussed the Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Law. She said the virtual public meeting for the Bourne Scenic Highway median project is tentatively scheduled for May 18th.

Mary Jane Mastrangelo said that the Policy Subcommittee started working on some of the policies of Buzzards Bay Park, reserving fields, the Community Building, and the Wedding Policy. She said they are considering doing a change to the Special Events policy.

Judy Froman said that there is a Community Engagement Committee meeting next Wednesday.

13. Adjourn

1. Public Comment on Non-Agenda Items

- a. Public comments are allowed for up to a total of 12 minutes at the beginning of each meeting. Each speaker is limited to 3 minutes for comment. Based on past practice, members of the Board are not allowed to comment or respond.
- 2. <u>Joint meeting with Finance Committee</u> Chair Meier said that the Finance Committee does not have a quorum for this meeting to be a joint meeting.
 - a. Status of Draft Warrant.

Town Administrator Marlene McCollem said that the draft warrant language is with Counsel for their review. She said that one item that just came up is regarding the departmental revolving accounts and Counsel is recommending that they place a bylaw into the town code to codify the existence of the departmental accounts. She said that it was a requirement of the Municipal

Modernization Act that appears it was overlooked and not done in Bourne. She said she considers this a housekeeping article. She said that she recommends that the Board of Selectmen insert an additional item in the consent agenda on the Annual Town Meeting Warrant to rectify and correct the situation.

Mary Jane Mastrangelo asked why this would be in a consent article rather than being a separate article in the Special. Ms. McCollem said it doesn't have to be in the consent article and it can be a stand-alone article in either the Annual or the Special if the Board is more comfortable doing that. Renée Gratis said she would prefer it to be a stand-alone article because it would be easier for the Finance Committee Report, and Ms. McCollem said that would be no problem at all.

b. Schedule and Responsible Parties for the Voter Handbook.

Chair Meier said there is a calendar that has been used in the past. He said that the Board of Selectmen would vote to post the warrant for the Special Town Meeting, vote to post the warrant for the Annual Town Meeting, discuss and vote on the final budget and the capital plan and review draft final motions, and vote on essential articles on April 5th, 2022.

Ms. McCollem said that she will be making one final budget amendment proposal during this meeting. She said she believes all the schools' numbers are all set.

Chair Meier said that after April 5th the final motions will be distributed to the Finance Committee and the Board of Selectmen on April 8th. The Finance Committee will vote on the final recommendations of all Annual and Special Town Meeting motions on April 11th. The Finance Committee Report will be available at the Town Hall and in the Library on April 12th. The Board of Selectmen will vote on final recommendations for Special Town Meeting and Annual Town Meeting motions on April 12th. The next day the Finance Committee recommendations and handbook comments are due to the Town Administrator by noon. The pre–Town Meeting will be on April 13th. The handbook will go to the printer and there will be copies available at Town Hall and the Library on April 15th. The Annual and Special Town Meeting is May 2nd.

The Finance Committee will vote on the essential articles on April 11th. There was some discussion on when the Board of Selectmen and Finance Committee will vote on all the articles and when the Finance Committee Report is due.

Amy Kullar, Town Meeting Moderator, said that she would like to set the time for the pre-Town Meeting. It was decided the meeting will be at 3 PM in the Community Building.

Chair Meier said that the warrant, the motions, and the explanation of articles have already been submitted by Ms. Gratis to Ms. McCollem. Ms. McCollem said she will handle putting together the voter handbook and she will distribute it when she has a final draft. Ms. Gratis said to clarify that until they take votes, Ms. McCollem has the handbook and Ms. Gratis will add to it after April 11th. Ms. McCollem said that she believes all the motions for this Town Meeting are written in the affirmative and she would like to confirm whether it is necessary to put in what a yes vote means and what a no vote means. Chair Meier said that yes, it should be done because it makes it easier for the Town Meeting attendees.

c. Logistics and Process.

Chair Meier said that at the Pre-Town Meeting on April 13th, they will go over the setup of the stage. Ms. McCollem wanted to confirm that the intention is to not force social distancing at the Town Meeting and to have the room set up how it was prior to COVID-19. Ms. Kullar said it is her intention to follow all relevant Board of Health guidelines at the time of the Meeting, and right now they are not enforcing any pandemic guidelines in public. Ms. Mastrangelo said that there is an additional meeting on the 27th so they can make the necessary adjustments at that time if protocols have changed.

There was some discussion about having a Town Meeting 101. It was decided by the Board that it really is not needed at this Town Meeting.

Ms. Gratis said that she wanted to discuss if all want to continue with the Finance Committee presenting the articles at Town Meeting. She said that they will still get up to the microphone to state their recommendations, and she wanted to bring this topic forward in case others have ideas about how the process should go. Ms. Mastrangelo said that she thinks it is helpful for the logistics of the Town Meeting for the Finance Committee to be the presenter. She said it works seamlessly. She said there is always an opportunity for other boards to make comments. She said she thinks it should continue this way because it is the tradition and that the Finance Committee handbook is written that way and she would encourage keeping the system in place.

Ms. Froman said that for many years she has wondered why the Board of Selectmen are not more involved with articulating their leadership and the articles that they bring forward. Although she agrees that it makes it smoother, and she is not saying to cut the Finance Committee out of it, she feels that it doesn't make sense to her to have the articles that are being brought forward by the Selectmen and to have the Selectmen sit there totally silent. She would like more conversations about this to look at different models.

Chair Meier agreed with Ms. Froman, and he thinks these discussions should happen this summer, and to keep this Town Meeting the way it has been without any changes yet. Mr. MacDonald agrees with Ms. Froman. He thinks if an article is being brought forward by the Board, then the Board should present it. Kate Jones agrees with Chair Meier about having conversations this summer and she wanted to bring to light the turnover on the Finance Committee, and she questions if the presenting at Town Meeting could be a barrier for some people that would otherwise be interested in being part of the Finance Committee. Mr. Slade agrees that more conversations are needed to have on this topic. Chair Meier said that the Charter requires that the Finance Committee make recommendations on each article.

Ms. Gratis said that she just wants to make it clear that her intent is not to remove the Finance Committee from the Town Meeting Process at all. She knows that there are people that wanted to have this discussion about presenting articles. She is fine with delaying this discussion until summer and holding this Town Meeting like it always has been held. Chair Meier said he will make sure this topic is not forgotten.

Barry Johnson said that it has been the tradition that the School Committee and the Planning Board sit on the stage at Town Meetings, along with the Board of Selectmen, the Finance Committee, etc. Most of the people on both boards have communicated to him that they do not want to be on the stage, so he said they can be accommodated by reserving space in the front, especially because for this Town Meeting there is no zoning, and the School Committee is not presenting any articles other than inclusion in the budget. Chair Meier said this will be talked about more at the Pre-Town Meeting on the 13th.

3. Selectmen's Business

a. Discussion and possible vote relative to the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget and Fiscal Year 2023 Capital Plan.

i. Budget amendment for the Town Administrator's Office.

Ms. McCollem said that at the last Board of Selectmen's meeting the staff in the Town Administrator's Office was discussed. She was under the assumption that there were conversations about the staffing that happened before her arrival and found out they did not. She would like to ask for an amendment to the Town Administrator's budget for FY23 with a reduction of \$22,315. This reduction allows her to keep the existing staff in the office status quo. The staffing would be a full-time Town Administrator, a full-time Assistant Town Administrator, a full-time Executive Assistant, a full-time Administrative Assistant, and a part-time Administrative Assistant. The full-time Administrative Assistant will be shared 25% Sewer and 75% General Fund. The budget that she would like to request for the Town Administrator's office is \$442,108.

Voted: Mary Jane Mastrangelo moved, and Jared MacDonald seconded to reduce the Town Administrator's budget by \$22,315. to \$442,108.

Roll Call Vote – Jared MacDonald – yes, George Slade – yes, Judy Froman – yes, Mary Jane Mastrangelo – yes, and Chair Meier – yes.

ii. Budget amendment for the WWTP electricity line.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has reviewed the document "Draft Technical Memorandum J-1 Range Southern Additional Monitoring Well" (the Tech Memo) dated April 2022. The Tech Memo proposes the location of a new monitoring well along Checkerberry Lane in the Town of Sandwich to monitor the migration/attenuation of the J-1 Range Southern 1,3,5-trinitroperhydro-1,3,5-triazine (RDX) plume. MassDEP offers the following comment on the Tech Memo.

On page 2 the text states, "The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) in a letter dated 21 January 2022 requested installation of a new monitoring well on Checkerberry Lane to monitor RDX attenuation and/or dispersion." MassDEP requested the installation of a drive-point well along Checkerberry Lane in a comment letter dated November 20, 2021 on the *Draft J-1 Range Southern 2021 Annual Environmental Monitoring Report* dated November 2021. Please note this in the text.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has reviewed the document "Draft Technical Memorandum: J-2 Range Northern Perchlorate Plume Shell Development" (the Tech Memo) dated April 2022. The Tech Memo was prepared by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) on behalf of the Army National Guard Impact Area Groundwater Study Program (IAGWSP) at Joint Base Cape Cod (JBCC). The Tech Memo details the development of the 2022 perchlorate groundwater plume shell for the J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume. MassDEP offers the following comments on the Tech Memo.

1. MassDEP agrees with the methods used to update the J-2 Range Northern perchlorate groundwater plume shell with groundwater data acquired since 2017. MassDEP supports the IAGWSP's recommendation to incorporate the 2022 J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume shell into future fate and transport models for J-2 Range Northern groundwater and for use in evaluations and comparisons made in future J-2 Range Northern environmental monitoring reports. However, MassDEP notes that some discretion is necessary when considering model predictions concerning overall perchlorate groundwater plume mass in the J-2 Range Northern plume due to uncertainties in the perchlorate groundwater plume shell.

2. Page 1, Objectives:

The text indicates "The goal of plume shell development for the J-2 Range Northern plume is to derive a reliable estimate of the magnitude and distribution of perchlorate concentrations, using all existing monitoring well and profile data, for use in simulating future conditions". MassDEP notes that although the J-2 Range Northern 2022 perchlorate groundwater plume shell provides a reasonable estimate of the distribution of perchlorate in the J-2 Range Northern groundwater, there are lines of evidence that indicate that the magnitude of perchlorate concentrations and mass in the

2022 groundwater plume shell may not be an accurate representation of the actual perchlorate plume mass. These lines of evidence are discussed in the following comments in this letter.

3. Page 3, Methods, Transient Groundwater Flow Simulation (Vista-MODFLOW):

The text states "All boundary conditions, with the exception of well extraction rates and treated water re-infiltration rates, were held constant throughout the transient simulation. Groundwater extraction rates varied according to the actual measured rates from wells within each respective model domain (stress period)". Please indicate if future extraction and re-infiltration rates are adjusted in the transient simulation and indicate the dates and magnitude of any future extraction and re-infiltration rates in the transient simulation.

4. Page 5 Methods, Comparison with Measured Concentrations and Calibration:

The text indicates "The reliability of the newly developed plume shell was evaluated by comparing recently measured and predicted perchlorate concentrations at respective extraction wells. This comparison was completed as a means of averaging out all the measured and often contradictory perchlorate concentrations and to account for elevated concentrations in areas without direct The extraction well concentrations represent an average of all incoming contaminant diluted by the groundwater extraction rate and while these concentrations cannot directly be used to determine the reliability of point-by-point concentrations within the plume, they can be used to quantify whether the concentrations in the immediate vicinity of the extraction wells are reliable. This approach was taken because the distributed sources and the episodic nature of contaminant releases had produced a heterogeneous sequence of intermingled plumes rather than a larger cohesive perchlorate plume; and given the relatively small number of in-plume wells in the monitoring network, the general distribution of contamination is far better understood than the magnitude of contamination. Furthermore, it is presumed that if the concentrations in the immediate vicinity of the extraction wells are reliable, then the concentrations within the other measured portions of the plume are also reliable". MassDEP notes that the J-2 Range Northern groundwater model does not accurately predict initial perchlorate influent concentrations at extraction well J2EW0002 using the 2022 groundwater plume shell. This discrepancy is discussed in further detail in the following comments.

5. Page 5 Results:

The text states "Measured concentration data from the three extraction wells in the J-2 Range Northern plumes (J2EW0001, J2EW0002, and J2EW0003) was compared with predicted concentrations to determine the reliability of the plume shell at representing concentrations within the model domain". MassDEP notes that the J-2 Range Northern groundwater model does not accurately predict initial perchlorate influent concentrations at extraction well J2EW0002 using the 2022 groundwater plume shell. This discrepancy is discussed in further detail in the following comment.

6. Page 6, Results, Perchlorate Plume:

The text indicates "The predicted mass of perchlorate in the plume shell is determined to be 1.26 lbs. at a concentration greater than 0.35 μ g/L, 0.55 lbs. at a concentration greater than 2 μ g/L, and 0.04 lbs. at a concentration greater than 15 μ g/L". MassDEP notes that it is likely that the 2022 groundwater plume shell underpredicts the actual perchlorate mass in the J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume. Table 3-3 on page 3-2 of the *Draft J-2 Range Northern 2021 Environmental Monitoring Report* dated February 2022 indicates that the Wood Road and Jefferson Road extraction, treatment, and re-infiltration (ETR) systems removed a combined total of 2.44 pounds (lbs.) of

perchlorate from the J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume for the period of November 2020 through October 2021. Intuitively, it seems unlikely that only 1.26 lbs. of perchlorate remain in the J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume based upon the perchlorate mass removal rate for 2021.

It is likely that there is substantial perchlorate mass upgradient of extraction well J2EW0002 that is not detected by the J-2 Range Northern groundwater chemical monitoring well network. The text indicates on page 6 of the Tech Memo "The predicted extraction well perchlorate concentrations at the J-2 Range Northern extraction wells (Figure 3) all started out at less than 1.4 µg/L at the initiation of the recently developed plume shell. The predicted extraction well perchlorate concentration at J2EW0001 was initially 0.88 µg/L, which then decreased to less than 0.35 µg/L by mid-year 2022; J2EW0002 was initially 0.46 µg/L before increasing to 1.39 µg/L by mid-year 2022 and then decreasing to less than 0.35 µg/L by year 2026; J2EW0003 was initially ND before increasing to 0.04 μg/L by mid-2022 before gradually declining to ND. Measured extraction well concentrations were available on a monthly basis from March 2007 through December 2021 for J2EW0001, J2EW0002, and J2EW0003 and were generally higher than predicted, especially at J2EW0002, but were still relatively low". MassDEP notes that perchlorate concentrations of 4.2 μg/L and 3.9 µg/L were detected in the influent of J2EW0002 in September 2021 and February 2022, respectively. These influent concentrations are nearly an order of magnitude higher than the influent concentration of 0.46 µg/L predicted for J2EW0002 at the initiation of the 2022 groundwater plume shell. Figure 3, J-2 Range Northern Predicted and Observed Extracted Perchlorate Concentrations illustrates the discrepancy between the predicted and observed perchlorate influent concentrations at J2EW0002.

The text states on page 6 of the Tech Memo, "Given that the plume shell was not calibrated to match measured extraction well concentrations and that both predicted and measured perchlorate extraction well concentrations are relatively low, it is considered that the plume shell was able to reasonably replicate current measured concentrations to a degree that suggests the model will be able to reasonably predict long-term concentrations". MassDEP notes that there is uncertainty concerning the ability for the J-2 Range Northern groundwater model to reasonably predict long-term perchlorate concentrations in the J-2 Range Northern groundwater plume based on the information provided in this comment.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has reviewed the document "Draft Technical Memorandum: J-2 Range Northern PFAS Evaluation" (the Tech Memo) dated April 2022. The Tech Memo was prepared by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) on behalf of the Army National Guard Impact Area Groundwater Study Program (IAGWSP) at Joint Base Cape Cod (JBCC). The Tech Memo documents the IAGWSP proposal to collect additional groundwater samples for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) analyses to refine the conceptual site model for PFAS identified within the J-2 Range Northern operable unit. MassDEP offers the following comments on the Tech Memo.

General Comment:

1. MassDEP recommends that the IAGWSP provide a figure in the Tech Memo indicating the locations of all the wells in the J-2 Range Northern operable unit that have been sampled for PFAS, with the locations color coded relative to the PFAS6 Massachusetts Maximum Contaminant Level (MMCL) for reference.

Page-specific Comments:

1. Page 2, Background:

The text indicates, "Results from samples collected in December 2021/January 2022 indicated that four wells along Gibbs Road had PFAS6 concentrations above the MMCL of 20 ng/L (i.e., MW-330M1 (28.1 ng/L), MW-330M3 (20.5 ng/L), MW-337D (42.0 ng/L), and MW-345M1 (32.5 ng/L–duplicate))." MassDEP notes that the January 2022 sample results for monitoring well MW-293M1 also exceeded the MMCL with a PFAS6 detection of 34 ng/L. Monitoring well MW-293M1 is located upgradient of Gibbs Road and within the capture zone of the J-2 Northern groundwater extraction system. Please include the MW-293M1 PFAS6 January 2022 sample results in the text.

2. Page 2, Recommendations:

The IAGWSP recommends installing two new monitoring wells along Gibbs Road and a third monitoring well downgradient of Gibbs Road for further delineation of PFAS6 in the vicinity of Gibbs Road. MassDEP recommends that the location of the monitoring well downgradient of Gibbs Road be finalized once the PFAS6 results from the two new wells along Gibbs Road are received. PFAS6 sampling results from these two wells would be helpful in determining the optimal location for the third monitoring well proposed for installation downgradient of Gibbs Road.

3. Table 1, J-2 Range Northern Proposed PFAS Sampling Well Construction:

The screen elevations for monitoring wells MW-293M1, MW-337D, and MW-345M1 are listed as N/A on Table 1. MassDEP notes that data in the Electronic Document Management System (EDMS) for these wells indicates sampling depths of 296 ft - 306 ft below ground surface (bgs), 310 ft - 320 ft bgs, and 311.5 ft - 321.5 ft bgs for monitoring wells MW-293M1, MW-337D, and MW-345M1, respectively. These sampling depths can be readily converted to feet mean sea level (msl) based upon the surface elevation of these wells. Please provide the screen elevations for these wells in feet msl in Table 1.


