John J. Emmert



The Reverend Deacon John Joseph Emmert Sr. of Sagamore Beach died unexpectedly on March 2. He

He was born in Dorchester to Leo and Bridget Emmert. After his father died when he was 14, Mr. Emmert augmented his mother's housekeeping salary by working at a fruit stand while attending Catholic Memorial High

He studied business and engineering at Boston University and Northeastern University but found his true calling as a doorman at some of Boston's finest hotels.

Joint Base Gun Range The Barnstable County Board of Regional Commissioners reaffirmed its opposition to the proposed machine gun range on Joint

Base Cape Cod at its meeting Wednesday. In September 2021, the commissioners sent a letter to state regu-

lators expressing their opposition. The commissioners oppose the proposed \$11.5 million machine gun range because of its potential to contaminate the region's single-source aquifer. Military training activities—involving weapons such as machine guns, 12-gauge shotguns, grenade launchers and pistols—are expected to take place on the site. The site is already suffering from past military activities that caused significant cost to tax-

payers in cleanup measures. The proposal has drawn sharp criticism from environmental organizations and residents who feel their health may be put at risk with additional pollution or contamination concerns resulting from the planned exercises.

Commissioners Catchup

In other news, the commissioners authorized the award and execution of an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant in the amount of \$619,463 to the Town of Dennis to fund water quality projects that will focus on the town's impaired water bodies and meet the requirements of the 208 Plan and MS4 permit.

The projects will include constructing natural solutions to improve infiltration, increase flood control capacity and improve resiliency. The ARPA funds will provide the matching funds needed for grants intended for water quality improvement projects

Paul Ruszala, the county's asset and infrastructure manager, briefed the board on the status of the identification and cleanup of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) at the former fire training site, highlighting details such as routine PFAS sampling, groundwater pump and treat system performance, new PFAS exploration work, coordination with the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection and budget planning.

The opioid settlements, led by Governor Maura T. Healey when she was attorney general, resulted in more than \$26 billion in national payouts and more than \$500 million to Massachusetts. At this point, the agreement includes Cardinal, McKesson, AmerisourceBergen and Johnson & Johnson. Walmart, Teva Pharmaceuticals, Allergen, CVS and Walgreens were also recently added.

These five additional settlements will send an estimated \$420 million to the commonwealth. To join this second settlement, interested municipalities must submit participation forms to the state by April 18.

Leslie Dominguez-Santos and Jeanne Morrison of the Barnstable County Human Rights Advisory Commission updated the board on the commission's work, highlighting events such as the Human Rights Academy and ongoing efforts to educate the community.

The board specifically discussed the need for further education regarding aboriginal rights of groups such as the Mashpee Wampanoag

Sonja Sheasley, the county communications manager, discussed the upcoming celebration of National County Government Month during April 2023. Ms. Sheasley plans to launch a campaign bolstering awareness of the county's role, specifically around water quality initiatives on Cape Cod.

April's theme, "Barnstable County is Protecting Cape Cod's Water," will feature a landing page on www.capecod.gov with posts, calls to action, tips and trivia throughout April. Details about an art contest for grades 1 to 12 will arrive later this month.





Joint Base Gun Range The Barnstable County Board of Regional Commissioners reaffirmed its opposition to the proposed machine gun range on Joint

Base Cape Cod at its meeting Wednesday. In September 2021, the commissioners sent a letter to state regu-

lators expressing their opposition. The commissioners oppose the proposed \$11.5 million machine gun range because of its potential to contaminate the region's single-source aquifer. Military training activities—involving weapons such as machine guns, 12-gauge shotguns, grenade launchers and pistols—are expected to take place on the site. The site is already suffering from past military activities that caused significant cost to tax-

payers in cleanup measures. The proposal has drawn sharp criticism from environmental organizations and residents who feel their health may be put at risk with additional pollution or contamination concerns resulting from the planned exercises.

Commissioners Catchup

In other news, the commissioners authorized the award and execution of an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant in the amount of \$619,463 to the Town of Dennis to fund water quality projects that will focus on the town's impaired water bodies and meet the requirements of the 208 Plan and MS4 permit.

The projects will include constructing natural solutions to improve infiltration, increase flood control capacity and improve resiliency. The ARPA funds will provide the matching funds needed for grants intended for water quality improvement projects

Paul Ruszala, the county's asset and infrastructure manager, briefed the board on the status of the identification and cleanup of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) at the former fire training site, highlighting details such as routine PFAS sampling, groundwater pump and treat system performance, new PFAS exploration work, coordination with the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection and budget planning.

Vaira Harik, assistant county administrator, and Kate Lena, program manager at the Department of Human Services, provided an update on the National Opioid Settlement Funds, including an update on the county's funds and its process, timeline and priorities for spending, as well as the advisory role the county is undertaking.

The opioid settlements, led by Governor Maura T. Healey when she was attorney general, resulted in more than \$26 billion in national payouts and more than \$500 million to Massachusetts. At this point, the agreement includes Cardinal, McKesson, AmerisourceBergen and Johnson & Johnson. Walmart, Teva Pharmaceuticals, Allergen, CVS and Walgreens were also recently added.

These five additional settlements will send an estimated \$420 million to the commonwealth. To join this second settlement, interested municipalities must submit participation forms to the state by April 18.

Leslie Dominguez-Santos and Jeanne Morrison of the Barnstable County Human Rights Advisory Commission updated the board on the commission's work, highlighting events such as the Human Rights Academy and ongoing efforts to educate the community.

The board specifically discussed the need for further education regarding aboriginal rights of groups such as the Mashpee Wampanoag

Sonja Sheasley, the county communications manager, discussed the upcoming celebration of National County Government Month during April 2023. Ms. Sheasley plans to launch a campaign bolstering awareness of the county's role, specifically around water quality initiatives on Cape Cod.

April's theme, "Barnstable County is Protecting Cape Cod's Water," will feature a landing page on www.capecod.gov with posts, calls to action, tips and trivia throughout April. Details about an art contest for grades 1 to 12 will arrive later this month.

The board also authorized the execution of a HOME Investment Partnership Project Development Agreement with Scranton Main LLC for the Barnstable County HOMEfunded Scranton Main project in

The current traffic plan has bicyclists turning right onto Adams St, then taking an immediate left onto Cranberry Hwy, crossing four lanes of moderate speed traffic. Two lanes are very close to the off ramp from the Mid Cape Hwy with obstructed views from the curve and two lanes have views that may be obstructed by the cement barricade and vehicles parked at the Canal Café. The PD would prefer that cones be required to be placed the length of Adams St, separating the Bike and the travel lane. We would temporarily allow bikes to travel opposite the one-way designation utilizing the bike lane. The officer at Adams St would direct bikes to turn LEFT into the bike lane on Adams St and the police traffic post at Cranberry Hwy would be moved to Adams @ Sandwich Rd. Bikes would be directed to turn right onto Sandwich Rd where they would continue toward Sandwich on Sandwich Rd. This route would also give the bikes the right of way at the Sandwich Rd/Cranberry Hwy intersection, as opposed to the current plan where they would need to yield to traffic on Sandwich Rd if they came from Cranberry Hwy. The department feels this is the safest option for both our officers and the bicyclists.

Unless otherwise directed by police officers, bicyclists must follow all traffic laws including at intersections and crosswalks.

If the police detail goes unfilled voluntarily and an officer needs to be ordered to work for public safety, rate assessed will be the officer's overtime rate.

Brandon Esip, Feb 3, 2023

Ride monitors cannot direct or interfere with the flow of vehicular traffic and must remain out of roadway.

Brandon Esip, Feb 3, 2023

Discussed with Best Buddies and agreement was reached to change the route to have bicyclists turning left into the Adams St bicycle lane and then turn right onto Sandwich Rd. PD to deploy traffic cones prior to 10AM to separate bicycle lane and vehicular lane and police details would be required for Adams St and Adams St/Sandwich Rd. Also agreed that all bicyclists would follow traffic laws unless directed otherwise by a police officer. Best Buddies agreed that monitors would not direct or impede the flow of traffic and would remain out of the road. They would also contact the department when all riders have passed Adams St so the cones can be removed promptly. The police detail requested at Old Plymouth and State Rd would be optional and not filled if officers did not voluntarily take it.

- This Special Use Permit does not grant permittee exclusive use of Corps of Engineer lands or facilities at the Cape Cod Canal and should at no point; supersede any regulations governing use of the Cape Cod Canal. In addition, portions of the project including the Canal Service Roads, may be under construction at any time. Permittee should be prepared to adjust event to meet changing conditions.
- 2. This event is scheduled as The Coalition for Buzzards Bay Watershed Bike Ride to begin in Westport and end in Woods Hole. Bicyclists shall use the access road at the western end of the recreation area but must use extreme caution when entering the recreation area parking lot and the access road that leads to the service road.
- 5. All bicyclists shall maintain a slow speed and watch for vehicles entering/ exiting the recreation area as well as other visitors in and around the Buzzards Bay comfort station.
- 6. A minimum of **two (2)** event volunteers will be stationed at the access point to the Canal service road at the Buzzards Bay Recreation area to direct and provide guidance to the arriving bicyclists.

<u>ARTICLE 8:</u> To see if the Town will vote to amend the **Bourne Zoning Bylaw** as follows or take any other action in relation thereto:

2/3rds Vote

Add a new section 2250 Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments after Section 2240 Accessory Scientific Uses.

2250. Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments

2251. Purpose, Authority, and Intent

a) These provisions are enacted pursuant to the Town's authority under the Home Rule Amendment to Massachusetts Constitution. It is recognized that the nature of the substance cultivated, processed, and/or sold by Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishments may have objectionable operational characteristics and should be located in such a way as to ensure the health, safety, and general well-being of the Bourne residents, the general public, patients seeking treatment, and customers seeking to purchase marijuana for adult use. This bylaw is intended to be used in conjunction with other regulations adopted by the Town of Bourne designed to encourage appropriate land use and reasonable safeguards to govern the time, place, and manner of Marijuana Establishments. The Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments bylaw is therefore necessary to advance these purposes.

b) Subject to the provisions of this Zoning Bylaw, and must be in conformance with all State regulations and licensing requirements of the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission (hereinafter referred to as "State CCC"), Medical Marijuana and/or a Marijuana Establishment shall provide medical support, security, and physician oversight that meet or exceed state regulation as established by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH), and to provide retail sales of marijuana for non-medical use in a manner that meets or exceeds state regulations.

2252. Applicability

- a) Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments shall be permitted when in compliance with the provisions of this section, all other Town of Bourne permits, license requirements, and with the proper Licensing of Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishments pursuant to MGL c. 94G, and regulations promulgated by the State CCC.
- b) The cultivation, production, processing, manufacturing, assembly, packaging, retail or wholesale sale, trade, distribution or dispensing of marijuana is prohibited unless licensed by the Massachusetts licensing agent and permitted as a Medical Marijuana and/or a Marijuana Establishment under this section.
- c) Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments shall be allowed by a Site Plan Review from the Planning Board the Permit Granting Authority (PGA) in accordance with the Use Regulation Schedule in Section 2220 and the Table of Allowable Uses in the Downtown District in Section 2821 provided the facility meets the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission and the requirements of this bylaw.
- d) The number of Marijuana Retailers shall be limited to a total of three (3) separate establishments within the Town of Bourne.
- e) Nothing in this bylaw is intended to regulate or prohibit uses or activities related to personal use of marijuana in accordance with MGL c. 94G.
- f) Adult use marijuana retailers may operate between the hours of 8:00 a.m. 11:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 10:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. on Sunday. Sales, distribution, and deliveries to and from the premises of marijuana shall not occur outside the hours of operation.
- g) Consumption of medical marijuana and adult use marijuana products at licensed marijuana establishments is prohibited.
- h) Social consumption of adult use marijuana is prohibited at patriotic, fraternal or social organization lodges or clubs, and properties used for general lodging or boarding, but not

- operating as a licensed marijuana social consumption operator.
- Patriotic, fraternal or social organizations lodges or clubs, and general lodging or boarding properties shall not offer marijuana for social consumption.

2253. Application Requirements

- a) Marijuana Establishments shall conform to Massachusetts 935 CMR 500.000 "Adult Use of Marijuana", in addition to any requirements herein as adopted, et. seq., including any subsequent updates.
- b) The Permit Granting Authority (PGA) is the Planning Board in accordance with section 1230 of this Bylaw. In addition to the submittal requirements and review standards provided in this Bylaw, each applicant shall submit:
 - 1. Copy of a fully executed Host Community Agreement.
 - Evidence of site control and right to use the site for a Medical Marijuana and/or a Marijuana Establishment in the form of a deed or valid purchase and sales agreement, or in the case of a lease, a notarized statement from the property owner and a copy of the lease agreement.
 - A commitment letter from the Board of Water Commissioners in the appropriate district where the Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishment would be sited.
 - 4. A wastewater allocation commitment letter from the Board of Sewer Commissioners for proposed developments in the Downtown District.
 - 5. A map depicting all properties and land uses within the distance requirements set forth in section 2254 of the project site, whether such uses are located in Bourne.

2254. Location Requirements

- a) Buffer Zone: Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishments buffer zones shall comply with all buffer zones as stated in Massachusetts 105 CMR 725 and 935 CMR 500.
- b) In performing Site Plan Review, and taking into consideration site conditions, the Planning Board may authorize exceptions to dimensional requirements of Section 2500 including buffer zone requirements of 935 CMR 500.110. The departure must be the minimum necessary to afford relief. Only the minimum relief needed shall be granted as to provide a viable project.
- No Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishment shall be located in the Scenic Development District.
- d) A minimum separation of 150 feet is required between Marijuana Retailers, but not including Medical Marijuana Dispensaries. Distances shall be measured in a straight line between the nearest points of the Marijuana Retailer buildings.
- e) No use variance for medical marijuana, marijuana establishments, marijuana social consumption operation, medical marijuana dispensary, or sale of marijuana accessories is permitted.

f) Permit Compliance: the Permit granted to the owner/operator of Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishment may transfer with a change in ownership of the business and/or property. The Planning Board, Planning Office, and Building Inspector shall be notified in writing within fourteen (14) calendar days of the permit holder business change, property change, discontinuance of use, or if the permit holder's CCC License expires, is not renewed or is terminated. Any failure to meet the requirement of this bylaw or Site Plan approval shall be grounds for revocation and will result in the immediate issuance of a cease and desist order by the Building Inspector ordering that all activities case immediately.

2255. Site Development Standards

- a) Medical Marijuana and/or Marijuana Establishments are subject to section 1230 and shall conform to the zoning bylaw, and any other requirements herein as adopted, and any amendments thereto.
- b) All aspects of a Marijuana Establishment, Registered Marijuana Dispensary, or Off-Site Medical Marijuana Dispensary, relative to the acquisition, cultivation, possession, processing, sales, distribution, dispensing, or administration of marijuana, products containing marijuana, related supplies, or educational materials shall take place at a fixed location within a fully enclosed building.
- c) No Marijuana Establishment, Registered Marijuana Dispensary, of Off-Site Medical Marijuana Dispensary shall be located within a mobile facility.
- d) If green houses are used for cultivation curtains shall be utilized to prevent light pollution and illumination outside the greenhouse from dusk to dawn and no outside air exchange shall occur.
- e) If provided, fencing and gates shall be a maximum of 6' high, and shall be decorative style wherever viewed from a public way or abutting property. Style of fencing and gates shall be approved by the PGA. Chain link fencing is prohibited wherever visible from the public way or abutting property.
- f) Medical Marijuana and/or a Marijuana Establishment shall comply with the Parking and Loading requirements in Section 3300. For the purposes of calculating parking, retail establishments are categorized under "Office, Stores" use. Marijuana Cultivator, Marijuana Manufacturer, Marijuana Product Testing Facility are categorized under "Industrial, Wholesale, or Warehouse" use.
- g) All security measures for the building shall comply with State CCC regulations and deemed appropriate to ensure patron and community safety and deter unauthorized access to the premises.
- h) No products shall be displayed in the Marijuana Establishment's window or visible from any street or parking lot.

i) All signage for Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Establishments must meet the requirements of section 2800 and section 3200 of this Bylaw. Any exterior sign may identify the Establishment, but shall not contain any other advertisement. The PGA may impose additional restrictions on signage as appropriate for the site, provided such regulations and restrictions do not conflict with State law or any State CCC regulation.

2256. Limitations

a) Any other type of licensed Marijuana Establishment not expressly defined as a Marijuana Cultivator, Craft Marijuana Cooperative, Marijuana Product, Manufacturer, Marijuana Retailer, Independent Testing Laboratory, Marijuana Research Facility, and Marijuana Transporter are prohibited.

2257. Marijuana Definitions

For the purpose of this bylaw, the following definitions shall apply:

Craft Marijuana Cooperative:

A Marijuana Cultivator comprised of residents of the Commonwealth and organized as a limited liability company, limited liability partnership, or cooperative corporation under the laws of the Commonwealth. A cooperative is licensed to cultivate, obtain, manufacture, process, package and brand cannabis or marijuana products to transport marijuana to Marijuana Establishments, but not to consumers.

Independent Testing Laboratory:

A laboratory that is licensed by the Commission and is:

- (2.a) accredited to the International Organization for Standardization 17025 (ISO/IEC 17025: 2017) by a third-party accrediting body that is a signatory to the International Laboratory Accreditation Accrediting Cooperation mutual recognition arrangement or that is otherwise approved by the Commission:
- (2.b) independent financially from any Medical Marijuana Treatment Center (RMD), Marijuana Establishment or licensee for which it conducts a test; and
- (2.c) qualified to test cannabis or marijuana in compliance with 935 CMR 500.160 and M.G.L c. 94C, § 34.

Manufacture:

To compound, blend, extract, infuse or otherwise make or prepare a marijuana product.

Marijuana or Marihuana:

All parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, not excepted below and whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; and resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin including tetrahydrocannabinol as defined in section 1 of chapter 94C of the General Laws; provided that "Marijuana" shall not include:

- i) The mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the stalks, oil, or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature stalks, fiber, oil, or cake made from the seeds of the plant or the sterilized seed of the plant that is incapable of germination;
- ii) Hemp; or
- iii) The weight of any other ingredient combined with marijuana to prepare topical or oral administrations, food, drink or other products.

Marijuana Cultivator:

An entity licensed to cultivate, process and package marijuana, and to transfer marijuana to other Marijuana Establishments, but not to consumers. A Craft Marijuana Cooperative is a type of Marijuana Cultivator.

Marijuana Establishment:

A Marijuana Cultivator, Craft Marijuana Cooperative, Marijuana Product Manufacturer, Marijuana Retailer, Independent Testing Laboratory, Marijuana Research Facility, Marijuana Transporter, or any other type of licensed marijuana-related business, except a medical marijuana treatment center.

Marijuana Product Manufacturer:

An entity licensed to obtain, manufacture, process and package cannabis or marijuana products and to transfer these products to other Marijuana Establishments, but not to consumers.

Marijuana products:

Products that have been manufactured and contain marijuana or an extract from marijuana, including concentrated forms of marijuana and products composed of marijuana and other ingredients that are intended for use or consumption, including edible products, beverages, topical products, ointments, oils and tinctures.

Marijuana testing facility:

An entity licensed to test marijuana and marijuana products, including certification for potency and the presence of contaminates.

Marijuana Retailer:

An entity licensed to purchase and transport cannabis or marijuana product from Marijuana Establishments and to sell or otherwise transfer this product to Marijuana Establishments and to consumers. Retailers are prohibited from delivering cannabis or marijuana products to consumers; and from offering cannabis or marijuana products for the purposes of on-site social consumption on the premises of a Marijuana Establishment.

Medical Marijuana Treatment Center: also known as Registered Marijuana Dispensary as defined by 105 CMR 725.000.

Registered Marijuana Dispensary (RMD):

A not-for-profit entity registered under 105 CMR 725.100: Registration of Registered Marijuana Dispensaries, that acquires, cultivates, possesses, processes (including development of related products such as edible cannabis or marijuana products, tinctures, aerosols, oils, or ointments), transfers, transports, sells, distributes, or administers marijuana, products containing cannabis or marijuana, related supplies, or educational materials to registered qualifying patients or their personal caregivers for medical use. Unless otherwise specified, RMD refers to the site(s) of dispensing, cultivation, and preparation of cannabis or marijuana for medical use.

Off-Site Medical Marijuana Dispensary (OMMD):

A Registered Marijuana Dispensary that is located off-site from the cultivation/processing facility (and controlled and operated by the same registered and approved not-for-profit entity which operates and affiliated RMD) but which serves only to dispense the processed marijuana, related supplies and educational materials to registered and qualifying patients or their personal caregivers in accordance with the provisions of 105 CMR 725.00.

Where not expressly defined in the Bourne Zoning Bylaw, the terms shall be interpreted as defined in G.L. c.9G, Section 1 and the regulations of the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission at 935 CMR 500, and otherwise by their plain language.

2258. Severability

If any provision of this bylaw or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid, to the extent it can be given effect, or the application of those provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby, and to this end the provisions of this bylaw are severable. If any provision of this bylaw is invalidated by subsequent legislation or regulation, or held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such provision shall be considered separately and apart from the remain provisions, which shall remain in full force and effect.

- e. Banking Institution Agreements to authorize the Treasurer and the Town Collector, pursuant to G.L. c. 44, § 53F, and with the approval of the Select Board, to enter into agreements with banking institutions to maintain deposits in exchange for banking services, for periods not to exceed three years.

Dear Ms. Forbes:

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has reviewed the Air Force Civil Engineer Center (AFCEC) response to comments letter (RCL2) dated January 20, 2023, in response to MassDEP comments dated June 22, 2022, for the document "Draft Remedial Investigation Report for Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances at Tanker Truck Rollover Sites" dated March 2022 (the TTRS RI). The RCL2 included a "Revised Draft Remedial Investigation Report for Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances at Tanker Truck Rollover Sites" (the Revised Draft TTRS RI). The Revised Draft TTRS RI presents the findings of the Remedial Investigation for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) at the Tanker Truck Rollover Sites at JBCC. MassDEP offers the following comments on the RCL2 and the Revised Draft TTRS RI.

General Comment:

1. It is insufficient to characterize the entire shoreline of Hen Cove and the northern portion of Red Brook Harbor (~2500' of shoreline) with only two sediment samples. The AFCEC should collect additional sediment samples and analyze them for PFAS to better characterize the sediment PFAS concentrations and to ensure that a PFAS/seep signature is not being missed.

Page-Specific Comments:

1. Page 9, RCL2, AFCEC Response to MassDEP Additional Comment for Page-Specific Comment #2: The AFCEC Response states "The results of the lysimeter sampling were used to develop a site-specific leaching value of 3.7 μg/kg for PFAS, of which, PFOS is the primary PFAS detected in TTRS soil. This site-specific leaching value, which was based on measured porewater concentrations at TTRS generally agrees with the site-specific screening value of 4 μg/kg previously calculated using the EPA soil-to-groundwater leaching models (as discussed in the March 2022 Draft TTRS RI)." The RCL2 and the Revised Draft TTRS RI do not elaborate regarding how the 3.7 μg/kg screening value or the previously calculated 4 μg/kg site-specific screening value were derived. Please provide detail in the Revised Draft TTRS RI regarding how the site-specific 3.7 μg/kg screening value was derived from

the lysimeter sampling and how the previously calculated 4 $\mu g/kg$ site-specific screening value was derived.

2. Page 3-6, Section 3.2, Nature and Extent of PFAS in Soil:

The text states "The lysimeter porewater samples provided direct measurement of PFAS concentrations that develop in vadose-zone porewater across a range of concentrations in PFASimpacted soil. The data obtained from this lysimeter pilot test were used to evaluate the PFAS concentrations in soil that may constitute a continuing source to groundwater at TTRS in accordance with the Massachusetts Contingency Plan 40.0985 (Determination of Method 2 Soil Standards Considering Leaching Potential) (MassDEP 2019). The results of the lysimeter evaluation at TTRS indicated that a PFAS concentration of approximately 3.7 µg/kg or greater in soil represents a leaching threat to groundwater. The details of the lysimeter evaluation are provided in Appendix F." Regarding the lysimeter data, the RCL2 and the Revised Draft TTRS RI are confusing. The AFCEC conducted lysimeter testing and calculated a 3.7 µg/kg value as a soil screening value. The Revised Draft TTRS RI refers to Section 3.2, Nature and Extent of PFAS in Soil and Appendix F, Derivation of Soilto-Groundwater Leaching Screening Values for details. Appendix F-1, PFOS and PFOA Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Levels-Tanker Truck Rollover Sites and Appendix F-2, Development of a Soilto-groundwater Screening Level for PFAS By Measurement of Vadose Zone Porewater PFAS Concentrations at Tanker Truck Rollover Site #1 provide detail regarding how the lysimeter data was collected and the type of lysimeter used for data collection but do not elaborate regarding how the 3.7 µg/kg screening value was derived. Section 3.2, Nature and Extent of PFAS in Soil also does not explain how the 3.7 µg/kg screening value was derived. Please provide detail in the Revised Draft TTRS RI regarding how the site-specific 3.7 µg/kg screening value was derived from the lysimeter sampling.

- 3. Appendix F-1, PFOS and PFOA Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Levels, Attachment 1, Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Level Interim Calculations based on a Lifetime Health Advisory Target <u>Groundwater Concentration, PFOS and PFOA Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Levels:</u> Assuming the USEPA, 1996 model is appropriate for this application, it appears that the AFCEC has underestimated the Soil Screening Level for Migration to Groundwater (Cs). The AFCEC uses 0.56 μg/kg as the soil screen for PFOS & PFOA. In Appendix F, Attachment 1 the AFCEC reports the Infiltration rate (i) as 0.00205 ft/day, based on annual rainfall of 30 in/yr (the 30 in/yr annual rainfall should be adjusted to 40 in/yr). However, the infiltration rate based on annual rainfall of 30 in/yr is calculated as 0.00684 ft/day (i.e., 2.5 ft/365 days=0.00684). This infiltration rate would raise the Dilution Attenuation Factor (DAF, or DF) which is used in the Target Groundwater Concentration (Cw) calculation. The erroneous reported Infiltration rate (i) elevates the resulting soil screening value. The AFCEC derived a soil screening value of 0.56 µg/kg. Replacing the erroneous Infiltration rate (i) of 0.00205 ft/day with the correct value, 0.00684 ft/day lowers the Diluted Target Groundwater Concentration (Cw-DIL) value from 0.00122 to 0.00042. The most significant calculation in this model is for the Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Level; Infinite Source (Cs). Correcting this variable results in a revised Cs value of 0.19 µg/kg, (190 ppt), roughly 1/3 of the number the AFCEC derived. Please adjust the model in the Revised Draft TTRS RI.
- 4. Page 6, Appendix F, Derivation of Soil-to-Groundwater Leaching Screening Values, Appendix F-1, PFOS and PFOA Soil-to-Groundwater Screening Levels, Section 5.0 Recommendation/Path Forward: The text states "...the soil-to-groundwater screening level of 12.7 μg/kg (3-ft source area thickness) is recommended for determining the extent of PFOS and/or PFOA soil contamination at the TTRS for the RI." This statement is confusing and contradicts the recommendation made in Section 3.2, Nature and Extent of PFAS in Soil "Both the lysimeter and model-based evaluations completed on

PFAS data collected at TTRS provide several lines of evidence that a PFOS concentration of approximately 4 μ g/kg provides a reasonable value for estimating the extent of soil contamination that represents a leaching threat to groundwater." The RCL2 and the Revised Draft TTRS RI do not elaborate regarding how the 3.7 μ g/kg screening value or the previously calculated 4 μ g/kg site-specific screening value were derived. Please provide detail in the Revised Draft TTRS RI regarding how the 3.7 μ g/kg and 4 μ g/kg site-specific screening values were derived.

- 5. Page J3-7, Appendix J, Supporting Documentation for the Ecological Risk Assessment, Section J3.0 Screening -Level Exposure Estimate and Risk Calculation, Section J3.3 Preliminary Effects Evaluation: Section J3.3 mentions the Simpson et al. (2021) paper and the corresponding PFOS sediment toxicity threshold of 250 μg/kg for PFOS. In lieu of any available sediment benchmarks, comparison of sediment data to the Simpson numbers may be a useful screen for PFOS sediment benthic toxicity. Because the Simpson paper derivation relies on organic carbon content of the sediment, MassDEP recommends all future sediment samples include organic carbon analysis.
- 6. Page J4-2, Appendix J, Supporting Documentation for the Ecological Risk Assessment, Section J4.0 Refined Exposure Assessment, Section J4.2.1 Dietary Intake:

 Section J4.2.1, Dietary Intake indicates that detailed assumptions and values used for estimating dietary exposure are presented in the tables of Appendix J, Attachment 3, Detailed Dietary Food Web Exposure Models and Hazard Quotient Calculations. Attachment 3 contains four pages of ProUCL outputs for PFOS and PFHxS, however does not contain any food web details and no Hazard Quotient Calculations. Please revise the Revised Draft TTRS RI to present the Hazard Quotient Calculations and the narrative clearly and accurately for the Food Web Exposure Models.
- 7. Table 3-5, Appendix J, Supporting Documentation for the Ecological Risk Assessment, Preliminary Screening Value Selection, Baseline Ecological Risk Assessment Problem Formulation:

 Benthic invertebrate exposures are not included in the preliminary screening ecological risk evaluation. Screening of this exposure pathway should be included in the risk characterization. Please revise the Revised Draft TTRS RI to include screening of this exposure pathway in the risk characterization. Proposed sediment data collection are necessary to adequately assess the potential impacts to sediment in Hen Cove and Red Brook Harbor.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has reviewed the document "Draft Technical Memorandum: Demolition Area 1 Base Boundary Optimization at D1-EW-3" (the Tech Memo) dated March 2023. The Tech Memo proposes the optimization of the Demolition Area 1 base boundary groundwater treatment system at extraction well D1-EW-3 to improve capture of the Demo-1 groundwater plume. MassDEP has the following comment on the Tech Memo.

Page 3, Proposed Additional Packering states, "If packer installation occurs after the annual Demo 1 synoptic gauging event has occurred, then water levels at those monitoring wells included in Table 1 (64 wells including North Pond), would be collected within 2-months of packer installation and system restart, but no sooner than two weeks following packer installation." Please include a figure in the Tech Memo indicating the locations of the monitoring wells recommended for the post-packering synoptic gauging event.

Dear Bourne Select Board,

The last questioner at MassDOT's March 29, 2023, Virtual Public Information Meeting on the proposed Sagamore Bridge replacement asked if MassDOT would consider keeping one of the bridge abutments as a scenic overlook after demolition of the existing bridge.

The program manager's answer was that MassDOT is considering including a scenic overlook along the descent of the shared use path from the bridge, and MassDOT would let the public know what that would be once they decide what they are going to do.

Public landscape architecture is a well developed discipline, similar to planning and development of public monuments. It is well established that the design of public spaces should be conducted with concept and execution deriving from public desires and not from concepts presented to the public by a project designer. Public space design is landscape architecture, not landscape engineering. The essence of architecture is exploring and elucidating the client's vision. That is not the role MassDOT has described for itself and not a role that MassDOT is suited to.

The Town of Bourne, as a stakeholder and through its role in the stakeholder process of this project, should insist that MassDOT open this aspect of the project to develop landscape design concepts through direct public involvement with professional landscape architects.

Our Town has experience at repurposing the 1910-1935 Perry Avenue bridge abutment. Three Mile Look in Buzzard's Bay along with a repurposed modern Sagamore Bridge abutment would make great book ends for viewing the Canal. There also may be other spaces opened for repurposing through the use shifts of the Canal Area Program. The Town and the public community should have a central role in shaping the new addition to open spaces. The Town should also have some voice in determining the custodian of the newly created spaces and access and maintenance standards for the custodian to follow.

Potential custodians might be MassDOT, the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (MassDCR), the Army Corps of Engineers, or even the Town of Bourne. One might be surprised to see MassDCR in this list, but DCR might be the most qualified and most logical choice. MassDCR owns and manages Scusset Beach reservation as a year round facility, so already has a presence in the Canal Area. MassDCR also manages and maintains park spaces in Boston and Cambridge including clearing snow from sidewalks and shared use paths on all bridges over the Charles River.

MassDCR is the only State agency to clear snow from State owned sidewalks and paths the Cape Cod Canal Area. Perhaps MassDCR should be the custodian of all state owned paths and open space created by Canal Area Transportation Improvement Program, just as DCR is for MassDOT owned paths and sidewalks in Boston and Cambridge.

Other than MassDCR, the Town of Bourne is the only entity who clears snow from State owned sidewalks in the Canal Area, and does so for all state owned sidewalks in the Canal Area within the Town of Bourne.

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
Bridges update: Lane closures and replacement public meetings

Beginning on March 20, 2023, vehicle travel over the Sagamore Bridge was reduced from the current two lanes in each direction to a single 12-foot-wide lane in each

direction. Lane restrictions will be in place 24 hours a day until crews complete the project. Repair work and lane restrictions are scheduled to run through May.

This work on the Sagamore bridge is scheduled maintenance, separate from the Massachusetts Department of Transportation's (MassDOT) Cape Cod Bridges Program, which will include the replacement of the Bourne and Sagamore bridges, provide new connections to the local roadway network and improve multimodal accommodations within the Cape Cod Canal area.

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
