- 3. BRIEFING. The parties' briefs must be filed in compliance with the Massachusetts Rules of Appellate Procedure and Standing Order Concerning Electronic Filing. The appellant's brief and appendix is due within 40 days of the above entry date and the appellee's brief within 30 days after service of the appellant's brief. - **4. ELECTRONIC FILING.** Attorneys must e-file all non-impounded briefs and record appendices, docketing statements, and post-panel submissions in civil cases. Impounded documents and submissions by self-represented litigants may be e-filed. No paper original or copy of any e-filed document is required. - 5. FILING OF CONFIDENTIAL OR IMPOUNDED INFORMATION. Any document containing confidential or impounded material must be filed in compliance with Mass. R.
