My experience with corrosion analysis also exposed me to allowable content for inclusion of levels of particulate matter that compared with the corrosive effects of estuaries. Further the use of irrigation and over fertilization in agricultural settings not to mention accidental spillage of toxic liquids would suggest that regulations have a response element to deal with that.
