

Dear Members of the Board of Selectmen and Mr. Guerino,

Please be advised that the Bourne Housing Partnership, at its February 13, 2019 meeting, chose to recommend that the Town exercise its rights under the affordable housing deed rider for 12 High Ridge Drive to find an eligible buyer for the property. The Bourne Housing Partnership would be happy to serve as monitoring agent and to identify an eligible buyer as described in the deed rider. This process would be done in cooperation with the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development.

It is noted that the notice of intent to sell was received on February 11, 2019 and the deed rider requires a written response by the Town to the owner within 30 days, and notification of the Town's decision to DHCD.

### Section 1.9.1

Membership: There shall be a Bylaw Committee consisting of seven (7) voters of the Town, one shall be from the Finance Committee, one shall be from the Planning Board, and five (5) members at large, all of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen. In addition the Police Chief or Chief's designee shall serve as an Ex-Officio member, for advice and counsel. The Police Chief or Chief's designee shall be a non-voting member. \*

### Section 1.9.2

<u>Organization:</u> Members shall be appointed for 3-year terms. The terms shall be so arranged that the terms of all members of the committee do not expire in the same year. Members may be reappointed and they shall serve without compensation. Members may be re-appointed and they shall serve without compensation. Any vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment for the remainder of the vacant term. \*

### Section 1.9.3

Officers: The Committee shall elect a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Clerk from among the members at its first meeting on or after July 1st of each year. \*

Re: Best Buddies Challenge: Hyannis Port

Dear Mr. Guerino.

The twentieth Annual Best Buddies Challenge: Hyannis Port is set to take place Saturday, June 1, 2019. This is the annual fund raising event that will raise money for Best Buddies International. Best Buddies is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to establishing a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships, integrated employment and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

The Best Buddies Challenge - Hyannis Port is a 100 mile long bicycle ride starting in Boston and finishing at Craigville Beach in Hyannis Port. We also have a 50 mile start in Carver and a 20 mile start in Sandwich. Through my involvement with this event over the last fifteen years I recognize the support your communities offer to the safety of our ride. I have enclosed our route information regarding your town and we greatly appreciate your continued help. Police details are marked in the police column of the route notes and, as in the past, I will work with each department to hire the appropriate number of officers in the weeks to come. The number of riders participating in this event has been approximately 600 at the 100, 250 at the 50 and 200 at the 20. The cyclists will travel at their own pace, riders are required to wear helmets and abide by the rules of the road.

We will be holding our 35th annual Cape Cod Getaway MS Bike Ride on June 29th and 30th, 2019. This two-day, 150-mile bicycle tour attracts 2100 cyclists, who will ride from Boston, Mass. to Provincetown, Mass. to raise funds to support the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

We respectfully request the use of local and state roads in the town of Bourne for the ride. I have enclosed cues sheets showing our route. Cyclists will be instructed to ride single file, on the right side of the road, and to follow all vehicle law, including stopping at red lights and stop signs. This is a Rules of the Road ride.

Thank you for your participation in the Massachusetts Municipal Association's 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Essay Contest! The purpose of this contest is to raise awareness and interest among 8<sup>th</sup> grade students about local government issues and to encourage participation in local government and Massachusetts communities.

Local government affects every resident in every state, region, city and town. Schools, housing, waste collection and recycling, roads, parks and recreation, the library, police and fire stations are all run by local government. As a resident in your city or town you have a voice and an opportunity to affect change on a local level.

In Massachusetts, cities are governed by mayors and city councils. Towns are governed by select boards whose members are elected to one or two-year terms. For your essay, select one political or community issue that impacts people in your city or town. If you were the Mayor or a member of the Select Board in your city or town, how would you bring positive change to this issue? You may consider financial limitations, the size of your city or town and available resources. Include examples of the changes that you would make as the Mayor or a member of the Select Board and how those changes would impact your chosen issue.

#### **Essay Contest Rules:**

- Only current 8th graders in Massachusetts are eligible to participate.
- Word limit: 750 words or less, excluding the title.
- Well-organized, with an introduction, a body and a conclusion.
- Typed and double-spaced in size 12 Times New Roman font.
- Printed on one side of paper only.



As part of our ongoing commitment to deliver reliable energy and superior service to customers, Eversource has contracted with qualified tree contractors to perform routine vegetation maintenance within our electric system rights of way on or near your property. The work, which is scheduled to occur this year, is part of Eversource's continuing efforts to ensure reliable electric service to you and to thousands of homes and businesses throughout the region, especially during extreme weather events.

#### Why Tree Work is Important

- To protect the electric system, we remove tall-growing species from the right of way and cut branches extending into the right of way. These trees and branches pose a serious safety hazard, now or in the future, if they contact energized equipment.
- Vegetation contact with electric facilities my lead to power outrages that could impact thousands of electric customers. The clearing of trees and branches in and along the right of way will improve system performance, especially during severe weather events.

#### Work in Your Neighborhood:

The vegetation management work may include:

- Clearing of incompatible trees and/or removal of branches that are encroaching into the right of way.
- Removing tall-growing tree species that are incompatible to the transmission system, using manual climbing crew or mechanical tree-harvesting equipment, and tree-chipping machinery.
- Removal of vegetation within the cleared areas of the right of way, through cutting, mowing, and/or the application of approved herbicides.

#### What You Can Expect

We want you to know that this work will not interrupt electric service to your property. Work hours will typically be 7 am to 7 pm, Monday through Saturday. Due to weather or other unexpected circumstances, from time to time crews may need to work longer hours or on a Sunday.


In certain areas, this vegetation management scope may be more than what has been experienced in the past.

Based on the width of the right of way, the type and number of transmission lines, the location of the lines within the right of way and the topography, Eversource employs a "two-zone" vegetation maintenance method. This method establishes the following:

- The wire zone is the area directly under the transmission lines, extending out minimally 20 feet outside the wires. In this zone, all trees and brush are removed, and native, low-growing plant communities that have a mature height of 3 feet or less are preserved.
- The border zone is the area from outside wire zone to the edge of the cleared area or the easement edge. In this zone, incompatible tall-growing trees are removed and native trees and shrubs that have a mature height of 25 feet or less may remain where possible.

The diagram illustrates a typical right of way condition. This work is occurring within the existing edge of clearing. Your neighborhood may have a different configuration of transmission structures.



#### **Work Performance**

Eversource is using approved contractors to conduct this work. The work may be completed in several stages, or at various times during the year. Work may also be performed by different contractors depending on the scope of work required in the particular right of way. Trimming and tree removal is performed throughout the year. Herbicide application may be used to treat cut tree stumps or stems throughout the year, and selective leaf treatment can be performed when leaves are present.

#### Keeping the Wood from Cleared Areas

If you would like to keep the wood from trees cut on your property, please call 888-673-9943. The wood that is to be kept for your personal use will be placed along the edge of the maintained area within the right of way and outside of the wire zone and environmentally sensitive areas. Wood not left for personal use and cut branches will be slashed or diced and left within the right of way. Diced vegetation will not be left within access areas or within the cleared areas around structures and guy wires. Debris will also be kept out of water courses, stream and river banks and bodies of water including standing water in wetland areas.

The letter and door hanger are part of our requirements under the Commonwealth of Massachusetts regulation (220 CMR 22.00), providing notice of work in the transmission right of way.

#### CHAPTER 41. OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF CITIES, TOWNS AND DISTRICTS

#### TRUSTEES OF SOLDIERS' MEMORIALS

Chapter 41: Section 105. Powers and duties; membership; tenure; vacancies; rules and regulations

Section 105. Towns which accept gifts or bequests or appropriate money for the purpose of properly commemorating the services and sacrifices of the soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen who have served the country in war or persons who have rendered military service for the commonwealth in time of war may provide for a board of trustees to have charge and control of the construction of any such memorial, and to have the custody and care thereof after its construction. In cities the board shall consist of the mayor and five members appointed by him and approved by the council, three of whom shall be veterans and two of whom shall not be veterans of any war; two members shall be appointed for one year, two for two years, and one for three years, and as the term of each member expires, a successor shall be appointed for three years. Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner for the unexpired term. In towns the said board shall consist of the chairman of the board of selectmen, and five members elected by the town in the same manner as other town officers, three of whom shall be veterans and two of whom shall not be veterans of any war; two members shall be elected for one year, two for two years and one for three years, and as the term of each member expires, a successor shall be elected for three years; but until such board is elected, the selectmen may appoint a temporary board to serve until the next annual town meeting. Whenever a member who shall be a veteran is to be elected, the office shall be identified on the ballot and on nomination papers as "trustee of soldiers' memorials — veteran" and only candidates who are veterans shall be nominated. Whenever a member who shall not be a veteran is to be elected, the office shall be identified on the ballot and on nomination papers as "trustee of soldiers' memorials — non-veteran" and only candidates who are not veterans of any war shall be nominated. Any vacancy occurring in the town board shall be filled for the unexpired term by the remaining members. Such board may make such rules and regulations relative to the use of said memorials as they deem necessary. "War" as used in this section shall include, but not be limited to, the following military actions: Korean, Vietnam, Lebanon, and Grenada.

Tom,

I have had discussions with Chief Woodside and Chief Sylvester about the Feasibility Study conducted by BETA and we feel that we can make changes without endorsing their recommendation of a four-way stop plan. We feel these improvements can be accomplished without costing the town a lot money at this time. Please note, Barlows Landing Road is in our pavement management plans to be re-paved in 2019 Phase one (1) (MacArthur Boulevard to County Road intersection) and 2020 or 2021 for Phase two (2) (County Road intersection to Barlows Landing Beach). That would be the time to make changes to the intersection when we do Phase two (2).

In the meantime, we have come up with some actions to improve the intersection of Shore Rd and Barlows Landing Road:

- Remove Tree(s) at the corner of St. John's Church.
- Remove Tree on Shore Road in the area of #857.
- Remove Tree at the corner of Graziella's Restaurant.
- Remove shrubbery and such along Shore Road that borders the Corner Cafe Restaurant.
- Remove all current crosswalks.
- Restripe the entire intersection to reduce scope. Think Otis Rotary. All four corners.
- Move Stop lines and signs closer to the intersection on both sides of Barlows Landing Road.
- Purchase and install two (2) lighted stop signs (solar powered).
- Replace or update warning intersection ahead signs as needed
- Option: Replace crosswalks away from the intersection. White lines only with chevrons in the same. Increase crosswalk signage at each crosswalk.
